To the Honorable, the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio:

The undersigned Engineer, in obedience to the direction of your Honorable Body, made on the 16th day of June, 1913, has proceeded in the abovematter, and has made a level and survey of the line of said proposed ditch improvement, and set a stake at every hundred feet numbering down stream; and I have made a note of the intersections of lines and boundaries of lands, township and county lines, land marks, bench marks, and road and railroad crossings; and I herewith make report of the same, with profile, and plat and an estimate of the number of cubic yards of earth or other substance, to be removed, and the cost per cubic yard for each working section on said report indicated and of each section of one hundred feet.

The Dun No. 2 Ditch Improvement.

I have also made, and return herewith, a schedule of all lots and lands, and public and corporate roads and railroads, together with the name of the owners of such railroad companies, and of the names of the lessees operating the same, that will be benefited by said improvement; and an apportionment of the cost of location and construction, in money, to each lot and tract of land, road and railroad, according to the benefits which will result to each from the said improvement; and in apportioning the costs of such improvement the benefits to any lots or lands by diking the same in whole or in part, have been by me considered with other benefits and a specification of the manner in which the improvement shall be made and completed; the number of flood gates, water ways, farm crossings and bridges, including kinds and dimensions thereof; and such other matters as the undersigned deems important. ) Specifications of the Manner of Construction.

DUN DITCH NO..2.

This improvement shall be constructed a tile ditch from station 0 to station 22 of the main ditch, and an open ditch from station 22 to station 56 its terminus.

Sizes of Tile.

The tile to be used in the main ditch shall be, from station 0 to station 15+46, 12" tile, inside diameter, and from station 15+46 to station 22 15" tile, inside diameter.

Lateral No. 1 shall be tiled with 8 inch tile.

Open Ditch.

The Open Ditch shall be made 2 feet wide in the bottom and have side slopes of 1 1/2 to 1 as nearly as practicable. All dirt taken from open ditch to be removed 15 feet from the top of the banks and well scattered.

The trench for receiving the tile shall be cut down to the grade line as shown on the Profile filed herewith, and as indicated in Schedule "A" of this report.
