The construction of the improvement is necessary and will be conducive to the public welfare.

HEARING

The hearing scheduled for this date was called to order at 10 A.M. by the President of the Board with the Commissioners, the Engineer, the Auditor, Howard S. Foust, Dale E. Fulton, Mrs. Caroline Schlabach, Eli S. Holmes, Neva H. Rings, Carey Hollycross and Mrs. Chas. F. Miller present.

In the general discussion that followed, Neva H. Rings stated that in her opinion she would derive no benefit from the improvement and Mr. Holmes and Mr. Hollycross were of the opinion their land would be assessed in excess of the benefits to be derived from the contemplated improvement, while Howard Foust stated there should be some relief for the drainage problem that he has.

It was suggested by Commissioner Gola Mink that two plans be prepared by the County Engineer at the next meeting, one for the cleaning of the open ditch and cleaning and repair of the old tile line and the second to consist of the cleaning of the open ditch, cleaning and repair of the tile line and also constructing a new tile line along the same course of the old, with the general understanding that at the next meeting to be held, consideration will be given to the two plans by all interested persons and that at that time determine the method to be followed.

With this in view, and for the reason that it seems evident some improvement at least, is needed, the Commissioners made a finding in favor of the improvement providing for the submission of the two different plans by the Engineer.

REPORT OF COUNTY SURVEYOR

In the Matter of

To the Honorable The Board of County Commissioners, Madison County, Ohio:

The undersigned County Surveyor, in obedience to the order of your Honorable Body, made on the 10 day of June, 1940, proceeded in the above matter, and visited the proposed location of said improvement and made the necessary survey for the proposed improvement, as found by the Commissioners, and suitable maps showing the location of the land proposed to be assessed, and profiles showing the cutting and gradient of the improvement, and an estimate of the cost of the construction of said improvement; and set proper construction stakes, beginning at the upper terminus of the improvement, and noted the intersection of the line of the improvement with the land boundaries of separate owners, township and county lines, natural land marks, road crossings, or other lines or marks; and took and noted necessary levels off the lines of the improvement for contour purposes, to determine the area of the land subject to drainage, and to determine the land that will be specially benefited by the construction of the improvement.

I also established, at intervals of not less than one in each mile, in the most practical, permanent forms, and in locations where destruction or disturbance is improbable, bench marks from which the original levels of the improvement can be established. The relation of the assumed elevation used by me in my work upon this improvement, to the established elevation of the geological survey of the United States, in the the County, is as follows:-----

I also made a schedule of the work proposed to be done, showing the fall, the depth, the excavating to be done, the location of the permanent bench marks and their actual elevation above or below the base elevation used, the nature of the excavation, and the location of quicksand or rock, etc.

I also prepared a schedule containing the name of each owner of land, with a description of the land which I believe to be benefited by the proposed improvement, taken from the tax duplicate of the county, and have entered in said schedule the proximate number of acres benefited by the proposed improvement, and the amount that said land, in my opinion, ought to be assessed, according to benefits.

I also prepared proper working specifications for the construction of the improvement, including catch basins, retaining walls, size and kind of tile, etc.

I made estimates of the cost of excavating and of the cost of material and divided the construction of said improvement unto such working sections as were deemed expedient.

The said survey, maps, profiles, schedules, and reports are hereto attached and made a part hereof.

SPECIFICATIONS OF THE MANNER OF CONSTRUCTION

In the Matter of
 The Single County Ditch Petitioned for by
 Howard S. Foust

Surveyor's Office

 Proceedings for Construction

The tile starts at the catch basin on the East side of State Route 42 and is to be tiled as shown on plans, and the tile is to be layed on grade as shown on profile. No tile is to be covered until inspected by the Ditch Supervisor. The old 15" tile line was found to be in good shape when inspected, except about 20' on lower end where some old tile will have to be replaced.

The open ditch is to be constructed as per plans. The spoil banks are to be leveled so as not to be over 15" higher than the present surface.

The headwall is to be constructed as per plan. The sand and gravel is to be washed material. All steel to be new and free of all rust and dirt. The concrete is to be 1-2-3½ mix.

All trees are to be cut level with natural ground.

WHEREAS, This day the Board of County Commissioners being in regular session, present Armstrong, Mink, and plynell and this being the day fixed by said Board, in their order dated the 15th day of July, 1940, for the final hearing on the Reports and Schedules of the County Surveyor, on the estimated assessments, on claims for compensation or damages and on the proceedings for the improvement, and on application filed for change of route or change in the nature, kind and extent of the work proposed to be done; and

WHEREAS, We find that due and legal notice of this final hearing has been given as required by law; and

WHEREAS, Said Board has heard all the evidence offered in the proceedings and received and considered all the schedules and reports filed by the Surveyor; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That said Board review and reconsider the former order made by us dated the 10th day of June, 1940, in favor of said improvement; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we do hereby approve the maps, profiles, schedules and reports prepared by the County Surveyor, as amended in our order dated the 12th day of Aug. 1940; and

WHEREAS, This Board has considered the cost of location and construction, the compensation for land taken, the damages to land along or in the vicinity of the route of the improvement, the damages to land below the lower terminus of the improvement which may be caused by constructing the improvement, the sufficiency of the outlet, the benefits to the public welfare, and the special benefits to land needing the improvement, etc.; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the former order finding in favor of said improvement made by us at the first hearing on the 10th day of June, 1940, be and the same is hereby affirmed; and

WHEREAS, Objections to belproposed assessment having been by; Minnie L. Carey on the grounds that she also should be assessed for benefits derived by her property, and, by Howard S. Foust on the grounds that Madison County should also be assessed for benefits derived by the Highway System, and the Board having heard said objections and all evidence offered for or against the assessment proposed to be levied against any owner or on any land, as shown by the schedule of assessments filed by the Surveyor and any competent evidence on the question of benefits, and from an actual view of the premises; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the County Surveyor be and he is hereby directed to give at least two weeks' public notice as required by law of the time when and the place where bids will be received for furnishing any material for the improvement, or for the construction of the improvement, or any part thereof, and in case manufactured material is required for the construction of the improvement, the Surveyor is hereby directed to send copies of the notice by mail to dealers and manufacturers, and all bids shall be received at the office of the County Auditor; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, whereas the estimated cost of the construction and material required in said improvement does not exceed one thousand dollars, the notice of said letting be given by posting at the front door of the county court house, and be it further

RESOLVED, That said County Surveyor be and he is hereby directed to attend at said time and place so advertised by him and receive all bids submitted; and be it further

RESOLVED, That authority be and the same is hereby given to said County Surveyor to receive bids by public outcry, instead of sealed bids, such bids being taken separately for work and for material, and in accordance with the requirements of Sec. 6481, G.C.
