The undersigned Engineer, in obedience to the direction of your Honorable Body, made on the 29 day of March, 1911, has proceeded in the above matter, and has made a level and survey of the line of said proposed ditch improvement, and set a stake at every hundred feet numbering down stream; and I have made a note of the intersections of lines and boundaries of lands, township and county lines, land marks, bench marks, and road and railroad crossings; and I herewith make report of the same, with profile, and plat and an estimate of the number of the cubic yards of earth or other substance to be removed, and the cost per cubic yard for each working section on said report indicated and of each section of one hundred feet.

This improvement shall be made a tile ditch from Station 0 to Station 64+60 its terminus.

Lateral No. 1 shall be made a tile ditch throughout its entire length.

Lateral No. 2 shall be made a tile ditch throughout its entire length.

SIZE OF TILE.

THE MAIN DITCH shall have 8-inch tile from Station 0 to Station 10 and 10-inch tile from Station 10 to Station 29 and 12-inch tile from Station 29 to Station 64+60 its terminus.

LATERAL NO. 1 shall be tiled throughout its entire length with 6-inch tile.

LATERAL NO. 2 shall be tiled throughout its entire length with 6-inch tile.

All tile to be used in this improvement shall be first-class Cylindrical Drain Tile, free from cracks or checks or other defects.

The "Ys" used for making connections of Laterals shall be Vitrified Sewer Pipe "Ys."

The estimate for Tile and "Ys" includes the delivery of the same on the line of the ditch, each size of tile and each "Y" in its proper place. Any expense caused the Contractor for construction by failure to deliver, or by improper delivery, will be charged against the Tile Contract and deducted therefrom at time of settlement.

CONSTRUCTION.

The trench for receiving the tile shall be cut down to the grade line and on the gradients as shown on the Profile filed herewith and as indicated in Schedule "A" of this report. The trench shall also be cut in a straight line from one angle to another and the grade line kept uniform from one grade point to another.

In trenches thus prepared, the tile shall be laid and jointed as closely as possible so as to prevent any sediment from entering at the joint. Only sufficient dirt shall be placed on and around the tile to hold them in place until after they have been inspected by the Engineer in charge of the work. After inspection, if found satisfactorily laid, all new cuts shall be filled full, and where the ditch is constructed in an open channel, sufficient dirt shall be put on the tile to protect them from injury by freezing; by being tramped by stock; or by farming over them.

If the dirt taken out in making the trench is not sufficient, the banks shall be plowed down and pulled in over the tile to make a sufficient covering.

The contractor for constructing the tile ditch shall put in place all "Ys" and connect all Laterals, either old or new, without extra compensation; landowners to furnish tile needed, unless they require taking up and cleaning, or lowering for more than one rod.
