The construction of the improvement is necessary, and will be conducive to the public welfare.

The following is the course and termini of said proposed improvement, to-wit:

Commencing at or near the end of a large tile on land of the heirs of Amanda J. Pratt, deceased; thence following an open ditch or as near thereto as practical in a general easterly direction through the land of said Pratt heirs and land of Howard Westfall to Little Darby creek, or far enough to secure a good and sufficient outlet for lands draining into said tile ditch or into the above described outlet ditch.

Whereas, This being the day fixed by said Board in its order dated the 6 day of May, 1946, for the hearing on the petition in the above named improvement, the said Board met at its office, and conducted said hearing by causing the petition to be publicly read, together with all applications for and remonstrances against the improvement, and all applications for change or extension of the improvement, previously filed in writin; and

Whereas, After proper examination, said Board finds that due and legal notice has been given in the manner and for the length of time required by law, to all owners of land affected by said improvement; and

E--Specifications of the Manner of Construction

In the Matter of the Single
County Ditch Petitioned for
by Paul Sanford.

Engineer's Office, Madison County, Ohio.
Proceedings for deepening, and widening
of a ditch.

The 15" tile from Sta 0 plus 00 to Station 0-100 shall be taken up cleaned and relayed to the grade shown on profile-any defective tile shall be replaced by first class tile-

Bulkhead.

The bulkhead at the end of the 15" tile Station 0 plus 00 shall be constructed with the plans which are attached and made a part of these specifications.

The mixture shall be one part cement 2 parts of clean sharp sand and 4 parts of stone or washed gravel after the bulkhead is completed all excavated material and sufficient additional dirt shall be placed over the tile and back of the bulkhead to make a finished job Backfill will be paid for at the bid price per cubic yard.

The main ditch from Station 0 plus 00 to Sta shall be excavated to the grades and gradient shown on the profile and cross sections.

The bottom of the ditch shall be cut to a width of 3 feet and with slopes of 1 1/2 to 1--

All brush in the limits of cuts shown on the cross sections shall be grubbed. Brush outside the slopes of cuts shall be cut so as not to interfere with the contractor and all brush and grubs shall be disposed of by burning.

All excavated material shall be deposited well back from the ditch and shall be evenly spread to the satisfaction of the land owners signed statements from the land owners shall be secured by the contractor before final estimate will be given.

In case any land owner shall refuse to sign such a certificate the County Engineer shall decide whether or not the work meets the required specifications.

In depositing the excavated material care shall be taken that no draw or place where surface water enters the ditch shall be in any manner interfered with. It shall be the duty of the land owners to look after and remove all fences and water gaps crossing or along the ditch that will interfere with the work, and to replace said fences or water gaps after the work is finished.

The contractor shall exercise due care to cause no damage to fences, water gaps or bridges and in case damages of this kind is caused by the contractor he shall be held liable for the same.

The cost of the clearing and grubbing is included in the price bid for the excavation.

A clear right of way of 50 feet on each side of the ditch is reserved for construction purposes. This distance shall be measured from the top of the ditch bank.

Removal clean and relay 15" tile shall be paid for at the actual amount of work done as ordered by the Engineer at the bid price per rods.

Mr. Armstrong moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

Whereas, Said Board has heretofore, by Resolution duly passed on the 12th day of November 1946, affirmed its former order finding in favor of the improvement, of the County Ditch petitioned for by Paul Sanford and others, and

Whereas, It is now deemed necessary to issue and sell \$1067.52 of notes under authority of Section 2293-24 of the General Code of Ohio, and "The Uniform Bond Act" for the purpose of providing funds in anticipation of the levy of assessments according to benefits or of the issuance of bonds for the improvement of said County Ditch; and

Whereas, The County Auditor has certified the maximum maturity of said notes to be three years, which maximum maturity does not exceed the estimated life or usefulness of the improvement fixed by Section 2293-9 of the General Code of Ohio; and

Whereas, This Board has heretofore, by Resolution duly passed on the 12th day of November, 1946, determined that three years shall be the period of time, in semi-annual installments as taxes are paid, given the owners of land benefited to pay the assessment that may be made for the improvement; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio, that in the judgment of said Board of County Commissioners, it is now necessary in anticipation of the levy of assessments according to benefits or of the issuance of bonds to issue and sell the notes of said County under and by virtue of the authority of Section 2293-24 of the General Code of Ohio and "The Uniform Bond Act" in the aggregate sum of One Thousand Sixty Seven and 52/100 Dollars (\$1067.52), not exceeding in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which the assessment is levied, to provide a fund for the payment of the cost and expense of the improvement of said County Ditch according to the terms of said Resolution above referred to; and be it further

Resolved, That said notes shall be dated the 1 day of November, 1947, and shall be in the denomination of One Thousand Sixty Seven and 52/100 Dollars (\$1067.52) and shall be numbered eight.

Said note shall bear interest at the rate of four per centum per annum until paid, and the interest on said notes shall be payable on the 1 day of April and the 1 day of November, 1948, and until the principal sum of said notes is paid and as evidenced by interest coupons attached thereto. Said notes shall not be issued for a longer period of time than two years from date thereof and shall be payable at the office of the Treasurer of said County at London, Ohio, upon presentation and surrender of said notes and interest coupons as they respectively mature. Said notes shall be redeemable at any interest period.

Said notes shall be due and payable as follows: No. 8 Date April 1, 1948 \$1067.52

Said notes shall specify on their face the purpose for which they are issued, and that they are issued in pursuance of this resolution and under authority of the General Laws of the State Of Ohio, particularly Section 2293-24 of the General Code of Ohio and "The Uniform Bond Act", and shall be full general obligations of said Madison County, Ohio, and for the full amount thereof, and the full faith, credit and revenue of said County are hereby pledged for the payment of the principal and interest thereof at maturity.

Said notes shall be signed by the members of the Board of County Commissioners of said County, and The County Auditor and bear his seal, and the interest coupons shall have the facsimile signature of said County Auditor printed or lithographed thereon; and be it further:

Resolved, That said notes shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds hereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments and all of the assessments collected for the improvement shall be applied to the payment of the notes and interest thereon until both are fully paid; and be it further

Resolved, That there shall be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in Madison County, Ohio, in addition to all other taxes a direct tax annually during the years while such notes run, not less than that which would have been levied if bonds had been issued without the prior issue of such notes.

Said tax shall be, and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate, and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time, that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, levied, extended, and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which, together with all interest collected on the same, shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said notes, when and as the same fall due.

It is hereby determined that all acts, conditions and things necessary to be done precedent to and in the issuance of said notes in order to make the same legal, valid and binding obligations of said County have been done, have happened and have been performed in regular and due form as required by law and that the tax for the payment of the principal and interest as the same falls due and is payable does not exceed any limitations of taxation of said County, and that the amount of this note issue does not exceed any limitation of indebtedness as fixed by law.

Mr. Mink seconded the resolution and the roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:
