

1836 July 3rd Record of the State Road as Located from Dublin in Franklin County to Pleasant Valley in Madison County

Be the Board of Commissioners of Madison County in conformity with an act of the Legislature of the State of Ohio passed on the 26th day of February last who have laid out and do establish a State Road from the Town of Dublin in Franklin County on a straight line to the Town of Pleasant Valley in Madison County. the Survey of which is as follows to wit Beginning at the west side of the Town of Dublin in Bridge Street thence N 89° 10' W 7 Miles and 253 poles to Main Street in and at the East end of the Town of Pleasant Valley in Madison County crossing the line between the Counties of Franklin & Madison at 4 Miles & 219 poles Sugar Run at 6 Miles and 252 poles Darby Creek 7 Miles from 152 to 158 poles and the Mile trees are all Marked as the plot of the Road shows

Newton's Alterations

1836 Dec 5th At a Meeting of the Commissioners of Madison County a petition praying for an alteration of the North end of the Road leading from the fork of the Urbana & Reed Mill Road to London, Beginning a few rods South of the Conners School house, on said Road, thence to a corner of John Marquis & Abner Keiston's land, thence ~~to a corner of said Marquis & David Clements~~ land, thence Northwly on a line between said Marquis & Clements lands to the line of Union County

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Whereupon Farmay, Hemmenway, Demothy Johnston and Charles Adams, Brewer and Mr. Millikin, Surveyor were appointed to Meet at Conners School House, on the 10th instant and view Survey and Make Report to the next Meeting of this board according to law =

1837 March 6th Report returned favorable and Read =

June 6th No Objections being filed the following is ordered to be recorded and is declared a public highway and be opened according to law to wit = Beginning in the London Road, South of Conners School house running N 8° W 224 poles thence N 42° W 82 poles thence N 21° W 48 poles to the Union County line
