London, Ohio, Sept. 19th, 1907

Survey of the Dun Road in Deer Creek Township.

Beginning at a stone post in the London and Marysville pike, near the east edge of the gravel, said stone being a corner to the lands of McEldin Dun and the lands of Walter Dun; thence S. 34 degrees and 35 minutes E. (passing the corner of the lands of Walter Dun and the lands of Thomas Dun, deceased, at 2880 feet, the N. E. corner of Lot No. 1 in the division of the said Thomas Dun's land at 4099.02 feet and the N. E. corner of lot No. 2 at 5414.4 feet,) 8641.8 feet to a stone post in the center of the Wilson and Winget pike, the south east corner of the said McEldin Dun's land, also the N. E. corner of the said Thomas Dun's land, a distance in all of 8641.8 feet or 1.636 miles. The width of the above described road is Fifty feet.
