

Gwynned Road.

June 6th 1842

At a Meeting of the Commissioners of Madison County a petition was presented praying for a view and survey of a Road commencing at the Mouth of the Lane between Valentine Wilson and E. M. Gwynne about one Mile East of Sumnerford on the National Road, and to run to the Mouth of the Lane between John Arbuckle and Erastus Hothaway at the Junction of said Lane with the Lafayette and Mechanicsburg Road, following the line of the Lane toward from point to point as nearly as possible and also that so much of the Old Springfield & Columbus Road as lies between the East line of the lands of Thomas Taylor and the East line of the lands of Thomas Taylor may be vacated.

Whereupon William Minter, Stanley Wotton, and Abraham Simpson Viewed and Henry Warner Surveyor were appointed to meet at the Toll Gate west of Lafayette on the 1st of July next, and proceed to view, survey, and make Report to the next Meeting of this Board according to Law =

An application Wm Minter, Stanley Wotton, and Abraham Simpson Viewers, and John Bowen Surveyor were appointed to meet at the Toll Gate West of Lafayette on the 8th Saturday of February next 1843, and proceed to view, survey, and make Report to the next Meeting of this Board according to Law =

1843 March 6th Report returned favorable and Road =

111 June 6th No Objections being filed to the establishment of the aforesaid the following is ordered to be recorded, and declared a public High way, commencing about one Mile East of Sumnerford, on the National Road at the Mouth of the Lane between the lands of E. M. Gwynne and V. Wilson and running thence S. E. on and with said Lane 92 poles, thence S. by E. 150 poles to a Stake 30 feet South of the S. E. corner of T. Taylor's land, thence S. 22¹/₂ E. 152 poles (Crossing the Old Columbus and Springfield Roads at 80 poles) to the S. E. corner of said Taylor's land, thence S. 88¹/₂ E. 16 poles to the corner of Arbuckle and Hothaway's land; thence on and with their line S. 24¹/₂ E. 122 poles to the Mechanicsburg Road. And also that the vacation as prayed for be granted.
