Petition.

Filed March 1st 1880.

To the Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio.
Your petitioners, residents of said county, respectfully represent that it is necessary for the convenience of themselves + neighbors that the road be graded & graveled along the following route: Beginning at the Post Road about two miles East of Plain City, Ohio, at what is known as the old London Road; Running thence along said London Road, in a South Westerly course for a distance of about three hundred yds. to where the road leading from the Amity Pike past the farms of Washington Roby, L. M. Marshall, Michael Noon + others intersects said London Road; Thence in a South Easterly course through or by the lands of Samuel Taylor, Alvah Smith, Richard Jams, Michael Noon, L. M. Marshall, James Finch, Washington Roby, Arch Walker + Louisa Downing, to what is known as the Franklin + Madison County Free Turnpike (or the Amity Pike)

Your petitioners therefore ask that such proceedings may be had as are authorized and required by law for the improvement of the road along the above described route.

The condition of the foregoing obligation is such that whereas the said Michael Noon, James Finch and others have filed their petition with the Commissioners of Madison County, praying for the improvement of a road by grading and graveling the same along the following described route: Beginning at the Post Road, about two miles East of Plain City, Ohio, at what is known as the old London Road; running thence along said London Road in a South Westerly course for a distance of about three hundred yards to where the road leading from the Amity Pike, past the farms of Washington Roby, L. M. Marshall, Michael Noon and others intersects said London Road; thence, in a South Easterly course, through or by the lands of Samuel Taylor, Alvah Smith, Richard Jains, Michael Noon, L. M. Marshall, James Finch, Washington Roby, Arch Walker + Louisa Doiny to what is known as the Franklin + Madison County free turnpike (or the Amity Pike).

Now, if the petitioners shall pay the costs and expenses of a view and survey of said proposed road improvement, in case said Commissioners refuse to grant the prayer of the same, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Appointment of Viewers and Surveyor.

Quarterly Session March 1st 1880.

In the matter of the Road Improvement, Petitioned for by Richard Jams Sr. & others.

In this matter the following described petition was this day presented to the Board of County Commissioners.

(For copy of petition see Page 1 of this volume)

The Board of Commissioners find that said petition is signed by more than five resident land owners, whose lands will be assessed for the expense of the improvement asked for. And at the same time said petition was presented a bond was also filed, signed according to law, conditioned for the payment of the preliminary survey and report if the said improvement shall not finally be ordered.

Whereupon the Commissioners appointed W. J. Coover, W. H. H. Morgan & Robert Aea, three disinterested free holders of the county, Viewers; and J. Arnett, a competent surveyor, and ordered that they meet at Allen's school house, on Post Road, two miles East of Plain City, on the 1st day of April A.D. 1880, at 10 o'clock A.M., and after having been duly sworn, to proceed to examine, view, lay out or straighten said road, as, in their opinion, public convenience and utility requires, and report to the Commissioners at their next regular session; And that the County Auditor notify said Viewers and Surveyor of their appointment according to law.

Quarterly Session, June 7th 1880.

Motion.

Now comes Alvah Smith and moves the Commissioners to refuse to count the names on the 2^d + 3^d petitions, for the reason that the route described in the petition, on which a view was ordered, is not the route described in the 2^d + 3^d petitions therein named.

Quarterly Session, June 7th 1880. Length of road 2.48 Miles
 In the matter of the petition of Richard James^{and} others, for the improvement of a Road named in said petition. } Finding +c.

This day said matter came on for hearing upon the motion of Alvah Smith for the Commissioners not to count the names upon the petitions N^o. 2 + 3, as the descriptions in said petitions were not the same as that of N^o. 1. Whereupon the petitioners asked leave of the Board to introduce parole testimony to show that petitions N^o. 2 + 3. described the same route, with the same beginning and terminus, and same of the same intermediate points; which evidence the Board permitted the petitioners to introduce. To which, the Attorneys of Alvah Smith excepted. And thereupon the motion was overruled. To which ruling, Alvah Smith excepted.

Whereupon the case came on for hearing upon the petitions and remonstrances, and the testimony^{and} papers relating to the case, and was argued by counsel. And the Board do find that all things necessary to be done have been legal and lawful, and that a majority of the land owners whose lands are reported as being benefitted by the making of said improvement, and ought to be assessed for the making of the same, signed said petition for said improvement; that the same are for the improvement of said road; and that the said improvement is for the public convenience and welfare, and will be conducive to the same. That said Viewers report was duly^{and} legally made, and that the said report is hereby approved^{and} confirmed, and that said improvement ought to be made according to the report of said Viewers. It is therefore hereby ordered that said improvement be made as recommended by said Viewers and Surveyor and as specified in their said report. Which report is as follows. to-wit: The Hon. Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio.

Gents: The undersigned, by you appointed to view^{and} survey the road improvement petitioned for by Richard James and others, met at the Allen School House, about 2 miles East of Plain City, April 1st 1880, and being duly sworn, proceeded to the discharge of the duties of our several appointments. Taking to our assistance E. Shover and M. Fraser, Chairman^{and} J. Nile, Assn. we established the initial point of said improvement at a stake marked O, in the S. edge of the gravel on the Post Road intersected by the center line of said proposed road improvement; Thence we carefully viewed and surveyed the route of said improvement, locating the center line therein as follows: S. 56° 15'

Jams Road.

N. 15.46 chains ^(4¹/₂ miles) to a point far enough N. 56° 15' E. of a stake marked corner to A. Smith + S. Taylor - 15.56 so as to make the ditch on the N. E. of next line as it is at the beginning; Thence passing the residence of Lemuel Marshall, James E. Finch and others S. 34° E. to station 130.62 (station 100 ft.) at the intersection of said proposed improvement with the Amity and Williard road - and terminus of the improvement prayed for. whole distance 2.48 miles, nearly.

After a careful view, survey and examination of the route of said proposed improvement, as to the benefits that would result to the lots and lands along and adjacent to the same, we are of the opinion that public utility and convenience requires said improvement to be made.

We therefore recommend that you grant the prayer of your petitioners and that you order said improvement to be made according to the following specifications.

(Specifications will appear in copy of Contract.)

We do estimate the cost of improving said road, according to the foregoing specifications, at \$1,800.⁰⁰ per mile.

(The Lots and Lands returned by said Viewers as benefitted and ought to be assessed for the improvement will be found by referring to their report in book marked "Jams Road Book No: 1" also by reference to Commissioners' Journal F. Page 185 &c.)

And it is also ordered that J. Arnett, a competent engineer be, and he is hereby appointed to superintend the performance and completion of said work, who shall, with the approval of the County Commissioners make a contract for the performance of the work. Provided that said improvement shall be let in sections of not less than one half mile - and to the lowest ^{and} best bidder.

And it is further ordered that J. C. Bridgman, Joseph Williams and J. M. Flannigan, three disinterested freeholders of Madison County, be and they are hereby appointed to apportion the estimated expense of said improvement upon the real property embraced in this order, for improving said road according to the benefits to be derived therefrom; And that they meet at Allen's School House on Post Road on the 14th day of June A. D. 1880 at 10 o'clock A. M. ^{and} after being duly sworn to proceed to make said apportionment, upon actual view of the premises; and make their report to the County Auditor on or before the 21st day of June A. D. 1880. The lands and lots to be assessed are the lands and lots contained in the report of said Viewers and Surveyor aforesaid.

Remonstrances

To the Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio.

Whereas, S. M. Marshall, J. E. Finch, Michael Noon and others, have by petition to your Honor, asked for the improvement (by grading and graveling) of the following described road, to wit: Beginning about two miles East of Plain City on the South side of the Post Road, at or near what is known as the Allen School House in Sub District No. - in Darby Tp. in said county, and in the line of the old London Road; Thence in a South westerly direction, following the road bed of said road, a distance of about three hundred yards, to a point where the Finch + Downing road intersects said London Road; Then in a southeasterly direction, following the road bed of said Finch + Downing Road to the center of the Madison + Franklin County free turnpike, known as the Amity^d + Hilliard Pike.

Now, therefore, we, the undersigned freehold taxpayers residing within said County of Madison, Ohio, and residing or owning land within two miles of said road improvement, do hereby represent to your Hon. Board, that the public convenience does not demand and require the improvement of said road as prayed for by said petitioners; and do hereby protest and remonstrate against said road improvement.

Proceedings in this matter having been enjoined by petition of Alvah Smith et al. to the Court of Common Pleas and thence to the Circuit Court (District) and said Injunction being dissolved, the Commissioners here order that the Auditor of said Madison County give notice, by publication in the Plain City Dealer, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said county, that the report of the committee appointed to apportion the estimated expenses of said improvement will be for hearing on the 25th day of May, 1885.

This also being the day fixed for the hearing of the report of the Committee heretofore appointed to apportion the estimated expense of making the Road Improvement petitioned for by Richard Jams and others, the Commissioners, after finding that due notice of said hearing has been given as required by law, by publication in the Plain City Dealer, a newspaper published at Plain City, O. adjourned further hearing of said matter until Monday June 1st 1885.

Regular Session, June 1st 1885.

Commissioners' Journal Vol. 1 Page 377.

The Board having at their session held May 25th 1885. adjourned the hearing of the report of the Committee to apportion the estimated expense of making said improvement to this date, said matter now comes on for further hearing, and after hearing the evidence and careful examination of the apportionment, said Board are of the opinion that the same is unfair and ought not to be confirmed. It is, therefore, ordered that J. P. Bowers, D. R. Lucas and L. D. Converse be and they are hereby appointed a new committee to apportion the estimated expense of making said improvement, to meet at Plain City, on the 1st of June 1885, at 10 o'clock A.M. and after being duly sworn, to enter upon the discharge of the duties devolving upon them under their said appointment.

Said Committee shall report to the County Auditor on or before July 1st 1885.

J. Arnett, the Engineer, was instructed to re-sell said improvement in accordance with the law now governing same.

Contract with C. H. Guy + Co.

Article of Agreement made this First day of August, A. D. 1885, by and between C. H. Guy + Co. on the first part, and J. Arnett, as Engineer of the road improvement petitioned for by Richard Jams and others, and ordered to be made by the Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio, of the second part, witnesseth: That whereas, the said J. Arnett, in his capacity as Engineer of said road improvement published by hand bills or posters, that he would receive oral bids or proposals on August 1st, 1885, upon each section of one-half mile for improving said road, and whereas, the said C. H. Guy + Co. were the lowest and best bidders for improving sections 1, 2, 3, 4 + 5, being the entire road, as the same is marked upon the route of said road improvement, described in the viewers report thereof and recorded in the field book of the same. Now, in pursuance and in consideration of the premises and in consideration of the sum of Forty Two Hundred (\$4200.⁰⁰) Dollars, to be paid the said C. H. Guy + Co., party of the first part, do hereby agree and promise to execute, construct and finish, in every respect in the most substantial and workman-like manner, and to the satisfaction and acceptance of said Engineer and Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio, on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of November 1885, said sections 1, 2, 3, 4 + 5 being of of said road improvement, according to the following specifications, and the cuttings and fillings of said improvement as recorded in the field book of the same, and a correct copy of the said cuttings and fillings of said sections 1, 2, 3, 4 + 5, being the entire road, we hereby acknowledge is attached on page 2 of this article.

Specifications.

- 1st. The road must be opened to a width of 25 feet on each side its center line.
- 2^d. The road must be cleared of all obstructions to a width of 20 feet on each side of center line, by grubbing all trees, stumps, &c., from cuts and side ditches, and by cutting them off below the grade in fills.
- 3^d. The road bed must be smoothly and evenly graded to a width of 10 feet on each side of, and crowning six inches to its center line, with side slopes of one to one, leaving a 2 feet berm of unbroken earth at base of all fills.
- 4th. All side ditches must be made not less than 2 feet wide in the bottom, and the bottom must be made not less than 3 feet below the center dirt grade line of the road, with side slopes of one to one, unobstructed and continuous, leaving no ponds nor pools in side ditches, with complete drainage to all culverts.
- 5th. All culverts must be made of good sound white or burr oak material, timber hewn on three sides, with parallel

beddings; the side walls laid upon three sub-sills, 8 inches thick, the tops of which must be sunk well below the bottom of side ditches, faced and shouldered above to receive first logs, and each log above battered 1 1/2 inches from water way upon the one next below; the plans of best thrifty timber, 18 feet long and 2 1/4 by 6 to 8 inches, and spiked to 10 stringers, and top of culvert, when complete, must stand within four inches of the top of gravel grade, and all and sundry must be of capacity and dimensions sufficient for the place where used.

6. The grubbing, clearing, grading, ditching & culverting must be completed in parcels of not less than 80 rods, as above, to the acceptance of the Engineer, before the graveling of any such parcel is commenced.

7. Upon the road bed as above prepared must be spread, uniformly, a layer of clean gravel, free from dirt or loam, fine sand, 12 feet wide and 12 inches deep in the center and 12 at the sides, raking all coarse gravel into the bottom of gravel layer, leaving no stone that cannot pass through a 2 1/2 inch ring nearer than 4 inches of the top of gravel grade - in all, 2 3/4 4 2/3 cubic yards per mile.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that, whereas the said Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Ohio, have this day approved of the foregoing contract, at the request of the obligor herein. Now, if the said C. H. Guy + Co. shall well and truly perform the stipulations upon their part to be performed, or cause the same to be done, according to the true intent and meaning of said contract, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force.
