At a Meeting of the Commissioners of Madison County a petition was presented praying for a view and survey of a road, commencing at the school house near David Lumbard on the road leading from the Census Settlement to Mechanicsburg from thence by James Mcgrahed to Patricks Mill on Little Darby, from thence up the creek as far as the County line

Whereupon James Key, Jeremiah Converse, and James Calhoun Viewers and Henry Alder Surveyor were appointed to Meet at David Lumbard on the 16th this inst and proceed to view and survey said Road and Make Report to the next Meeting of this Board according to law =

1838 March 5th Report returned favorable and read =

1838 June 4th No Objections being laid in the following Road it ordered to be located, and declared a public highway and opened according to law to wit Beginning at a school house near David Lumbard, on the Road leading from Census Settlement to Mechanicsburg running S 57° 30' W. 246 poles, thence S 57° 30' W. 135 poles, S 45° W. 165 poles, S 22° 30' W. passing L Patricks Mill 52 poles, thence S 78° 46 poles, S 5° W. 20 poles, S 15° E. 24 poles to a Stake in the County line on the bank of Little Darby creek near the first Road, whole length two Miles & 88 poles =
