


Surveyed for William Brown, 1200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 712 on the upper side of Darbys Creek. Beginning at two elms and a hackberry, upper corner on the creek to said Brown's Survey No. 882, running up the creek with the meanders, N. 18 W. 60, N. 15 E. 20, N. 20 W. 24, N. 5 W. 54, N. 75 W. 25, S. 75 W. 20, N. 35 W. 40, N. 5 E. 60, N. 25 E. 36, N. 12 E. 145, N. 60 W. 50, N. 87 W. 12, N. 5 W. 96, N. 30 E. 10 poles to a black walnut and two buckeyes; thence

N. 53 E. 253 poles to two hickories and a white oak; thence S. 37 E. 505 poles to two ash's; thence S. 52 W. 505 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Charles Simms, 1200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 351, on the upper side of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a lynn and black oak, upper corner on the creek to said Simms Survey No. 1187, running up the creek with the meanders, North 40, N. 45 W. 38, North 30, North 12 E. 42, North 84, N. 45 E. 22, N. 25 E. 30, N. 48 W. 50, N. 18 W. 30, North 22, N. 35 W. 72, West 20, N. 40 W. 34,

North 32 poles to two hickories and two lynns; thence N. 52 E. 370 poles to two sugar trees; thence S. 37 E. 440 poles to two ash; thence S. 53 W. 550 poles to the beginning.
