

Surveyed for Richard Apperson 726-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5134 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at two Hickories, Southerly corner to James Steel's Survey No. 3725, running S. 48 W. 200 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 42 E. 140 poles to a Hickory and White Oak; thence S. 39 E. 442 poles to five Bur Oaks; thence N. 48 E. 166 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 42 W. 180 poles to a Bur Oak and two Hickories; thence N. 10 W. 75 poles to a bur oak and Hickory; thence N. 48 E. 20 poles to a bur oak and Hickory; thence N. 42 W. 136 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 42 W. 54 poles to a Hickory and Black Oak; thence N. 42 W. 210 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for William Croghan, 592 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5599, on the waters of Darby's creek.

Beginning at a large White Oak, Elm and Red Oak, Southerly corner to James Low's Survey No. 5193, running with his line N. 34 E. 144 poles, crossing a branch at 90 poles to two Honey Locusts, a Black Walnut and Elm; thence S. 85 E. 208 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence S. 38 E. 226 poles, crossing

a branch at 120 poles to a forked White Oak; thence S. 76 W. 130 poles to four White Oaks; thence West 180 poles crossing a branch at 30 and one at 140 poles to two White Oaks, one of them forked; thence S. 80 W. 110 poles to an Elm and Bur Oak; thence S. 52 W. 104 poles crossing a branch at 20 poles to two Elms and a Bur Oak; thence N. 30 W. 200 poles crossing a branch at 42 poles and one at 140 poles to a Black Oak, Bur Oak and an Elm; thence N. 25 E. 110 poles to a Bur Oak and small Hickory; thence with the line of said Low's Survey, S. 56 E. 148 poles to the beginning.
