


Surveyed for the Heirs of Nicholas Hobson, decd. 480 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5716, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at four Bur Oaks from two roots and a Hickory in the West line of William Creighton's Willow Spring Survey; thence running with his line and course thereof, South 400 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root; thence West 220 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence North 236 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence East 56 poles to a Black Oak forked, near the ground; thence North 30 poles to three Bur Oaks, two from one root; thence N. 27 E. 151 poles to a Bur Oak; thence East 104 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for the Heirs of Nicholas Hobson, decd. 630 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5715 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at two White Oaks, Southwest corner to William B. Harrison's Entry No. 6151, running with his line and course thereof N. 29 E. 290 poles to two Bur Oaks, one forked; thence S. 70 E. 154 poles to a Stake between three Bur Oaks, one forked and a White Oak cornered; thence North 92 poles to four Bur Oaks; thence East 160 poles to a Black Oak and White Oak; thence S. 19 E. 80 poles to three small White Oaks; thence S. 75 W. 98 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 29 W. 103 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 45 E. 6 poles to two White Oaks and a Black Oak, corner to Cornelius Baldwin's Entry No. 5796; thence with his line S. 34 W. 315 poles to three White Oaks in said line; thence N. 68 W. 14 poles to three White Oaks; thence N. 52 W. 205 poles to three White Oaks and a Black Oak; thence N. 35 E. 36 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Singleton Foster, assee. 195 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5554, on the waters of the East fork of Paint creek. Beginning at three White Oaks and two Black Oaks N. 20 W. 200 poles from two Black Oaks, Northeast corner to Thomas Hoff's Survey No. 3789; thence N. 20 W. 260 poles, crossing a branch at 120, at 170 and at 235 poles to two Black Walnuts and a Bur Oak on the west side of a prairie; thence N. 70 E. 120 poles to two Black Oaks and a White Oak; thence S. 20 E. 260 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Black Oak;

thence S. 70 W. 120 poles to the beginning.
