


Surveyed for the Heirs of Nicholas Hobson, decd. 450 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5716 on the waters of Deercreek and Darby's

creek. Beginning at a White Oak and two Hickories, Southeast corner to Survey No. 5861, on which Stortley now lives, on Arbuckle's glade, running with said line North 160 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence with another of his lines, West 100 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence with another of his lines, South 160 poles to a Bur Oak and Elm; thence with another of his lines, East 100 poles to the beginning. thence S. 18 E. 30 poles to a White Oak, Post Oak and Hickory; thence S. 52 W. 120 poles to a White Oak; thence West 90 poles to two Black Oaks; thence North 240 poles to two Hickories and a Black Oak; thence

S. 65 E. 55 poles to three White Oaks on the road from Kertley's to Cowan's Settlement; thence N. 10 E. 75 poles to a Black Oak and White Oak; thence N. 18 W. 110 poles to two White Oaks from one root; thence S. 80 E. 240 poles to a Stake; thence S. 10 W. 160 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence S. 80 E. 60 poles to four Hickories; thence S. 10 W. 120 poles to two Small Bur Oaks; thence S. 80 E. 26 poles to a Black Oak and White Oak; thence S. 10 W. 80 poles to four White Oaks; two from one root; thence N. 80 W. 58 poles to three Black Oaks and a White Oak in the line of a 100 acre Survey on which David Foster now lives; thence N. 30 W. 58 poles to the White Oak, Post Oak and Hickory above.

Surveyed for Thomas Worthington, assee. 900 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5111, on Bradford's fork,

a branch of Deer creek. Beginning at two White Oaks and a fallen Black Oak, Northerly corner to David Bradford's Survey No. 3972, running N. 65 E. 85 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 25 W. 124 poles to a Burr Oak; thence N. 60 W. 284 poles to two Hickories; thence N. 40 W. 130 poles, crossing a branch to a Black Oak; thence S. 88 W. 180 poles to a large Elm on the North Side of a prairie; thence S. 45 W. 101 poles to a White Oak and Hickory in the Northeast line of Elias Langham's Survey No. 4777; thence with said line S. 45 E. 100 poles to a Stake in said fork; thence with another of said Langham's lines, S. 45 W. 123 poles crossing a bend of said fork to two White Oaks, South corner to said Langham's Survey; thence S. 75 E. 307 poles to a Stake; thence S. 43 E. 196 poles to a Stake; thence N. 65 E. 157 poles passing the corner of Bradford's Survey and with the line thereof crossing the fork to the beginning.
