


Surveyed for John Gibson, 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 221 on Treacles Creek. Beginning at a black oak, ash and elm in the lower line of Jacob Woolstons entry No. 2836, 240 poles from the northeast corner of said Woolston, running S. 53 W. 400 poles crossing the creek at 100 poles, to three white oaks; thence S. 37 E. 400 poles to three white oaks; thence N. 53 E. 400 poles crossing the creek at 300 poles to a black oak and two hickories; thence N. 37 W. 400 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Peyton Powell, 400 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 1415 on the lower side of Treacles Creek.


Beginning at a white oak in a prairie where Ludlows Road from Franklinton to Springfield crosses said creek; thence up the creek with the meanders thereof, North

40, S. 53 W. 30, S. 61 W. 54, S. 38 W. 18, S. 60 W. 18, S. 70 W. 38, N. 63 W. 24, N. 29 W. 10 poles to a three pronged sycamore and honey locust; thence S. 13 W. 106 poles to three bur oaks; thence S. 77 E. 60 poles to two white oaks and a black oak; thence N. 78 E. 220 poles to a stake in a Glade; thence S. 42 E. 172 poles to two black oaks and a white oak; thence S. 77 E. 100 poles to a sycamore and elm growing together at the ground on the southwesterly bank of Treacles Creek; thence N. 13 E. 106 poles crossing the creek four times, to the beginning.

Surveyed for RobertDudley, 100 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 4593 on the waters of Darbys Creek. Beginning at two sugar trees in the line of the representatives of Thomas Sanders Survey

No. 3751 and southwest corner to William Taylor's Survey No. 3744, running with Taylor's line N. 53 E. 160 poles to an ash and elm, southeast corner to Taylor's Survey; thence S. 37 E. 100 poles to an ash and sugartree; thence S. 53 W. 160 poles to two sugartrees; thence N. 37 W. 100 poles passing the southeast corner of the representatives of said Sander's Survey to the beginning.
