

Surveyed for John Scarborough 1111 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 3414 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at two Black Oaks and two White Oaks, Southwesterly corner to Duncan McArthur's Survey No. 5195 in the line of Stephen Southhall's Survey No. 553; thence with said line N. 65 W. 348 poles to a White oak, Northerly corner to said Southhall's Survey; thence with another/line of said Survey, S. 64 W. 40 poles to two White Oaks from one root, Easterly corner to John Parrett and Joseph Thompson's Survey No. 3903; thence with their line N. 12 W. 167 poles to two White Oaks and Elm; thence N. 26 W. 170 poles to two Hickories and a Black Walnut; thence with the Easterly line of Ebenezer Owen's Survey No. 3902, N. 40 W. 390 poles to three White Oaks, two from one root, Northerly corner to Owen's said Survey, and Easterly corner to the Representatives of Mathew Arbuckle's Survey No. 3901; thence S. 70 E. 535 poles to four Bur Oaks near a road; thence S. 20 E. 600 poles passing the corner of said McArthur's Survey and with his line to the beginning.

Beginning at two White Oaks, East corner to Robert Mean's Survey No. 5046, and Northeast corner to David Bradford's Survey No. 3973, running N. 6 W. 203 poles to three Hickories; thence N. 85 E. 120 poles to a Bur Oak; thence S. 17 E. 320 poles crossing a small branch to two White Oaks and a Black Oak; thence S. 62 W. 203 poles crossing a small branch at 53 and one at 117 poles to two Hickories and two White Oaks in the line of said Bradford's Survey; thence with said line N. 5 E. 110 poles crossing the said East branch of Gladly run at 62 poles to the beginning.
