


Surveyed for James Galloway, Jur. assee. 140 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5874 on the lower side of Treacle's creek. Beginning at an Ash and five Lynns upper corner on the creek to Duncan McArthur's Survey No. 4742, running up the creek with the meanders thereof, West 5, N. 70 W. 21 poles to two Ashes, a Hickory and Sugartree; thence S. 40 W. 82 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 50 E. 224 poles to a Stake in the line of said Galloway's Survey No. 6653; thence with said line N. 23 E. 40 poles to three White Oaks, Northwesterly corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 67 E. 80 poles to a Stake and two Bur Oaks, corner to said Survey; thence N. 8 E. 140 poles to two White Oaks from one root, lower back corner to said McArthur's Survey; thence with his line S. 85 W. 162 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence N. 75 W. 22 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence N. 20 W. 66 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for James Galloway, Jur. assee. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5874 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak 140 poles S. 86 W. from the beginning corner of said Galloway's Survey No. 7063 for 60 acres, running N. 53 W. 160 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 37 W. 100 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 53 E. 160 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 37 E. 100 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for the Representatives of Anthony T. Dixon 306 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5727 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks and two Elms Southeast corner to Richard C. Anderson's Survey No. 6306, running S. 30 E. 30 poles to a Black Walnut, Elm and White Oak in the line of William Pelham's Survey No. 6570; thence with his line S. 60 W. 46 poles to two White Oaks, Westerly corner to his Survey; thence S. 30 E. 400 poles to two Hickories and an Elm, Southerly corner to said Survey; thence S. 60 W. 65 poles to a Stake in the line of David Bradford's Survey No. 5280; thence with his line N. 33½ W. 271 poles to two Hickories and two Elms, Northerly corner to his Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 56½ W. 102 poles crossing a branch at 80 poles to a Stake in said line; thence N. 19 W. 117 poles to a Black Oak and Hickory; thence N. 42 W. 90 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak; thence N. 2 E. 88 poles to two Hickories and a Bur Oak; thence N. 60 E. 48 poles to three Hickories in the line of said Anderson's Survey; thence with his line N. 11 E. 60 poles to two Red Oaks and a Hickory; Southwest corner to his Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 79 E. 160 poles to the beginning.
