

Beginning at two Black Oaks, Northwest corner to Gabriel Peterson's Survey No. 4637, running N. 60 W. 46 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 84 W. 284 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 6 W. 84 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 84 E. 192 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 64 E. 74 poles to two Black Oaks and a Bur Oak; thence N. 85 E. 62 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 9 E. 78 poles crossing a small branch to the beginning.





Beginning at two White Oaks, corner to John Morris' Survey No. 6508, 144 poles West from his Southeast corner, running S. 72 W. 180 poles to a Stake corner to said Moore; thence West 37 poles to a Stake; thence South 68 poles to a forked Bur Oak; thence East 184 poles to a Bur Oak in a prairie; thence N. 10 E. 124 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for George Galloway, assee. 220 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5717 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak in the edge of a prairie, 448 poles S. 66 E. from the lower back corner of James Galloway Jur's. Survey No. 5743, running N. 40 W. 28 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 88 W. 62 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 23 W. 70 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 76 W. 32 poles to two bur oaks; thence N. 60 W. 24 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence North 30 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 81 W. 78 poles to an Elm; thence S. 9 W. 38 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 17 E. 55 poles to three Hickories; thence East 44 poles to a Stake; thence S. 25 E. 34 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 65 E. 52 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root; thence N. 88 E. 152 poles to a Bur Oak and Black Oak; thence N. 51 E. 164 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 45 W. 70 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 85 W. 20 poles to four Bur Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 67 W. 96 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Samuel Galloway, assee. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5717, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two White Oaks, Southeasterly corner to William Moody's Survey No. 6545, running with his line N. 28 W. 8 poles to two Elms and two Bur Oaks; thence N. 52 E. 50 poles to two Elms and a Black Oak; thence S. 28 E. 106 poles, crossing a branch at 22 poles to two Elms and a Black Oak; thence S. 28 E. 106 poles, crossing a branch at 22 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence S. 62 W. 160 poles to two Ashes and an Elm; thence N. 28 W. 98 poles to a Hickory, Bur Oak and a forked Black Oak in Moody's line; thence with his line N. 62 E. 110 poles, crossing a branch at 74 poles to the beginning.
