

Surveyed for John A. Fulton, assee. 500 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5892 on the waters of the Spring fork of Little Darby. Beginning at a Stake in a prairie, Southeasterly corner to Lincoln Goodale's Entry No. 6645, and Southerly corner to Jesse McKay's Survey No. 6877, running N. 48½ E. 73 poles to three Hickories, a Black Oak and White Oak, Northwest corner to Thomas M.

Bayly's Survey No. 5497; thence with his line East 100 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Northeasterly corner to said Bayly's Survey and Southwesterly corner to said Bayly's Survey No. 6006; thence with the line of Survey No. 6006, N. 30 E. 230 poles to three Bur Oaks, Northwesterly corner to said Bayly's Survey and Southwest-erly corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 6320; thence with Galloway's line and course thereof N. 15 E. 180 poles passing his corner to three Bur Oaks, one of them forked on the North edge of a narrow prairie; thence S. 84 W. 60 poles to three Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 35 W. 220 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence S. 36 W. 236 poles to a Bur Oak, corner to said McKay's Survey; thence with his line S. 35 E. 274 poles to three bur oaks, Easterly corner to said McKay's Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 41½ W. 240 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Johnston 637 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5792, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two White Oaks and a Hickory 757 poles N. 77 W. from three Jack Oaks, Northwesterly corner to Gabriel Peterson's Survey No. 4637; thence North 171 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 53 W. 123 poles to three Bur Oaks, one of them forked; thence S. 23 W. 281 poles to a Black Oak, Bur Oak and Hickory; thence South 210 poles; thence S. 23° 30' E. 184 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 74 E. 114 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence North 144 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 3 W. 12 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 6 E. 212 poles to the beginning.
