

Surveyed for Thomas and David Gwynne, assees. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5941 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at a Stake in the line of the Representatives of Matthew Arbuckle's dec'd. Survey No. 3900, and Southeast corner of Daniel Rossland on which he now lives and purchased out of said Arbuckle's Survey, running with Arbuckle's line S. 67 E. 100 poles to two White Oaks from one root and two Hickories; thence with another line of said Arbuckle's Survey No. 3901, S. 75 E. 100 poles to three Black Oaks from one root; thence S. 23 W. 81 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 75 W. 100 poles to two white oaks and a Hickory; thence N. 67 W. 100 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 23 E. 81 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Mathew Hobson, assee. 220 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5944 on the north fork of Paint Creek. Beginning at a Stake on the North bank of the creek, running S. 29 W. 32 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 68 W. 204 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 42 W. 138 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 33 W. 150 poles to two White Oaks, one of them forked; thence N. 50 E. 64 poles crossing the North fork at 32 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 47 E. 100 poles to a Black Oak and Bur Oak; thence S. 42 E. 225 poles to a Bur Oak; thence S. 67 E. 128 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 29 W. 32 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Henry Brush, assee. 333-1/3 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5935, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at a Stake Northwest corner to William Washington's Survey No. 6061, six poles North from four Ashes, blazed, and chopped; thence with a line of said Brush's Survey No. 7176, West 120 poles to a Stake; thence North 200 poles with another of his lines, passing his corner at 170 poles to a Stake; thence West 190 poles to a Hickory and White Oak; thence South 200 poles to a Hickory; thence East 170 poles to a White Oak; thence South 24 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 38 E. 225 poles to a White Oak in said Washington's line; thence with said line North 200 poles to the beginning.
