


Surveyed for John Crawford (heirs)

Beginning at a sugartree, white oak and red oak, upper corner on the creek of Oliver Towles' Survey No. 2678, running up the creek, N. 13 E. 24, North 20, N. 10 W. 50, N. 34 W. 16, N. 45 W. 38, S. 50 W. 30, N. 58 W. 20, N. 14 W. 20, N. 5 E. 36, N. 26 E. 28, N. 20 W. 24, North 26, N. 15 W. 34, N. 25 E. 32, N. 32 W. 34 poles, crossing a branch at 28 poles, N. 9 W. 44, N. 42 W. 44, N. 20 E. 28 poles to three black walnuts; thence S. 53 W. 448 poles to two elms and two ash's; thence S. 37 E. 440 poles to a hickory, ash and white oak; thence N. 53 E. 272 poles to

the beginning.



Beginning at three black walnuts, upper corner on the creek to said Crawford's Survey No. 2679, running up the creek, N. 60 E. 50, N. 60 W. 32, N. 50 W. 34, N. 40 W. 18, N. 50 W. 94, N. 10 W. 34, N. 40 W. 38, N. 35 W. 16, S. 80 W. 12, N. 3 E. 36, N. 50 W. 10, N. 5 W. 20, N. 58 W. 76, N. 20 W. 15 poles to two lynns and a pea locust; thence S. 53 W. 385 poles to two white oaks and a black ash; thence S. 37 E. 400 poles to two elms and a white ash; thence

N. 53 E. 372 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Joseph Davisson, assignee, 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 1147 on the waters of Darby's Creek; Beginning at a stake, south-westerly corner to Stanley Chaffins Survey No. 4885; thence N. 37 W. 210 poles to a stake, northwesterly corner to said survey; thence S. 53 W. 53-1/3 poles to a stake in the back line of Andrew Torborne's Survey No. 2985; thence with and binding on said line S. 37 E. 300 poles to three black oaks, lower back corner to Torborn's said Survey, in the line of John Gibson's Survey No. 2682; thence N. 53 E. 53-1/3 poles to a stake in Gibson's said line; thence N. 37 W. 90 poles to the beginning.
