


Surveyed for Nathaniel Pendleton, 422 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 1391, on the waters of Deer creek.

Beginning at five Hickories, Northerly corner to James McNutt's Survey No. 4193, Easterly corner to William Evans' Survey No. 4124, and Southerly corner to David Bradford's Survey No. 3973; thence with the line of Bradford's Survey, N. 5 E. 273 poles to two Hickories and two White Oaks, Southerly corner to Duncan McArthur's Survey No. 6783; thence with his line N. 62 E. 206 poles, crossing a branch at 86 and one at 150 poles to two White Oaks and a Black Oak, Easterly corner to said McArthur's Survey; thence with another of his lines, N. 17 W. 107 poles to two Ashes and two Elms; thence N. 73 E. 53 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak; thence S. 40 E. 135 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, in the edge of a prairie; thence S. 60 W. 248 poles to a Stake; thence S. 20 E. 400 poles to a White Oak, Elm and Red Oak, Easterly corner to said McNutt's Survey; thence with his line N. 70 W. 292 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Graham, assee. and James Johnston, 190-2/3 acres of land on part of three Military Warrants, viz: Graham 20 acres on No. 5791, 98 acres on No. 5755 and Johnston 72-2/3 acres on No. 5792, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks from one root, Northwesterly corner to Johnston and Dun's Survey No. 7243; thence N. 81 W. 26 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 27 E. 121 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 63 W. 51 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 27 W. 120 poles to a Stake in a prairie; southerly corner to said Graham's Survey No. 7387; thence with his line N. 63 W. 75 poles to two Bur Oaks from one root, corner to Graham's said Survey; thence S. 21 W. 40 poles to three Bur Oaks, two of them from one root; thence N. 81 W. 94 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak; thence N. 9 E. 19 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 81 W. 50 poles to two Bur Oaks from one root, Southeasterly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 7753; thence with his line N. 88° 30' W. 46 poles to two Bur Oaks in said line; thence S. 10 W. 72 poles to two Bur Oaks in the line of Rice Haggard's Survey No. 7056; thence with said line S. 84 E. 151 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to said Survey; thence S. 60 E. 50 poles to three Jack Oaks, Northwesterly corner to Gabriel Peterson's Survey No. 4637; thence with Peterson's line S. 81 E. 147 poles to a stake in a prairie, in said line; thence N. 9 E. 66 poles to the beginning.
