


Surveyed for Benjamin Hough, assee. 172 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 93 acres on No. 5836 and 79 acres on No. 6006, on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks, two of them from one root, in the line of Absolom Bainbridge's Survey No. 4805, N. 84 W. 80 poles from his Southeasterly corner; thence with said line N. 84 W. 143 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root in said line and Easterly corner to John Graham and other's Survey No. 7474; thence with their line S. 24 W. 150 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Hickory, corner to said Survey; thence with another of their lines S. 51 W. 78 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line; thence S. 84 E. 180 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 24 E. 208 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 312 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 200 acres on No. 5783 and 112 acres on No. 5785, on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a large White Oak and two Hickories, Northerly corner to William B. Wallace's Survey No. 5064 in the lower line of Robert Mean's Survey No. 5281; thence with said line N. 50 E. 50 poles to three White Oaks, Easterly corner to said Mean's Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 17 W. 193 poles to a Red Oak and Bur Oak, another of Mean's corners; thence with another of his lines N. 22 W. 82 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak corner to said Mean's Survey; thence S. 71 E. 78 poles to three Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 54 E. 76 poles to a Jack Oak and White Oak; thence S. 17 E. 88 poles to a White Oak and small Hickory; thence S. 22 E. 36 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 38 E. 138 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak; thence S. 28 W. 179 poles to two Black Oaks, Easterly corner to said Wallace's Survey; thence with his line N. 50 W. 60 poles to a large White Oak, corner to said Wallace's Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 34 W. 146 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for William Fulton, assee. 60 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6014, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a White Oak and Hickory, Southeasterly corner to James Rice's Survey No. 4904, in the back line of John Crawford's Survey No. 2680; thence with Crawford's line S. 38 E. 188 poles to a sassafras; thence S. 52 W. 51½ poles to a White Oak; thence N. 38 W. 188 poles to a Red Oak and White Oak; thence N. 52 E. 51½ poles to the beginning.
