


Surveyed for John Graham, assee. James Johnston and Walter




Dun, asees. 640 acres of land on part of three Military Warrants, viz; Graham 265 acres on No. 5785, Johnston 300 acres on No. 5792 and Dun 75 acres on No. 5493, on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at three large Bur Oaks, from one root, in the line of Absolam Bainbridge's Survey No. 4805, N. 84 W. 223 poles from the Southeasterly corner of said Bainbridge's Survey; thence S. 24 W. 150 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 51 W. 186 poles to three Bur Oaks, two of them forked; thence N. 39 W. 70 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 62 W. 156 poles to a White Oak, Black Oak and Bur Oak; thence N. 62 W. 88 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 17 E. 100 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root; thence N. 88 E. 132 poles to six Bur Oaks two of them from one root and four from another; thence N. 8 E. 326 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory in the line of Obediah Smith's Survey No. 4807; thence with said line 208 poles, S. 67 E/ crossing drains at 36, a branch at 90, a drain at 135 and a branch at 185 poles to two Hickories and a large White Oak, Southerly corner to said Smith's Survey, and in the upper line of Bainbridge's said Survey; thence with said line, S. 6 W. 101 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak, Southwesterly corner to the said Survey; thence with another^{line} of said Survey, S. 84 E. 79 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Graham 233 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 37 acres on



No. 5785 and 196 acres on No. 5784, on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a Hickory and three White Oaks, near the lower edge of the barron prairie, N. 74 W. 600 poles from the upper corner on the creek to Caswell Gardiner's Survey No. 4940; thence S. 34 W. 76 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Black Oak; thence N. 60 W. 108 poles to two Black Oaks and a White Oak; thence N. 30 W. 64 poles to a Bur Oak, White Oak and Hickory; thence S. 88 W. 104 poles, crossing a small branch to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 55 W. 74 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 6 E. 79 poles, crossing Barron run to a White Oak and Bur Oak; thence S. 63 E. 80 poles to four White Oaks from two roots; thence N. 83 E. 98 poles to a Black Oak and Bur Oak; thence S. 63 E. 210 poles to three Black Oaks from one root and a bur Oak; thence S. 34 W. 58 poles crossing the run to the beginning.
