


Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 190 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5791 on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's creek. Beginning 265 poles N. 29 W. from the easterly corner of John Crawford's Survey No. 6201, at three Bur Oaks from one root, on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 28 E. 90 poles to two Bur Oaks from one root in a prairie; thence N. 59 W. 92 poles to a Bur Oak; thence West 96 poles to five Bur Oaks, three of them from one root; thence S. 26 W. 146 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 34 E. 65 poles to a White Oak, Bur Oak, Hickory and large Black Oak; thence N. 70° 30' E. 172 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 145 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5791 on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak and Black Oak, Northerly corner to Robert Mean's Survey No. 5281 in the line of the Representatives of William Case's Survey No. 5481; thence with said line N. 40 E. 24 poles to a Black Oak, White Oak and Red Oak, corner to said Case's Survey; thence with another line of the said Survey N. 10 E. 71 poles to a Red Oak and large Bur Oak in said line; thence N. 62 E. 136 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence S. 17 E. 192 poles to three Hickories; thence S. 80 W. 47 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak corner to Mean's said Survey; thence with the line of the said Survey, N. 75 W. 161 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 90 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5791 on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a Black Oak, East 40 poles from a Large Black Oak marked W.D. on the top of a ridge, known by the name of Davis' folly which lives on the head of Jonas Bradley Sanior's garden branch; thence North 60 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 79 W. 66 poles to four Bur Oaks from one root; thence N. 45 W. 123 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence South 136 poles to two Bur Oaks thence S. 66° 30' E. 134 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 47 E. 42 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 150 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants No. 5784 for 31 acres and 119 acres on No. 5755, on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks in the back line of Robert Vance's Survey No. 1095, S. 11 E. 147 poles from the upper back corner thereof; thence N. 53 E. 78 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 43 E. 184 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the line of Thomas M. Bayly's Survey No. 6000; thence with said line S. 53 W. 181 poles to two Hickories in said line and lower back corner to said Vance's Survey; thence with his back line N. 11 W. 205 poles to the beginning.
