


Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 310 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6075 on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at two Hickories and a Bur Oak, Southerly corner to John Graham's Survey No. 7386; thence S. 27 W. 34 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence West 200 poles to a Bur Oak; thence S. 69 W. 122 poles to four Bur Oaks, two of them from one root; thence N. 78 W. 50 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak in the line of James Johnston's Survey No. 7394; thence with said line S. 46 E. 93 poles crossing a branch at 84 poles to a large Black Oak and Small Hickory, corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Survey, North 50 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak another of said Johnston's corners thence with another of his lines, N. 71 W. 40 poles to a Hickory and Small Bur Oak in said line; thence N. 11 E. 75 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 85 E. 42 poles to two Jack Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 38 E. 77 poles to three Bur Oaks two of them from one root and a Hickory; thence N. 64 E. 100 poles to two Bur Oaks from one root; thence S. 80 E. 106 poles to two Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 73 E. 78 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the line of said Graham's Survey; thence with said line, S. 49 W. 43 poles to a Bur Oak, Westerly corner to said Graham's Survey; thence with another line of said Survey, S. 11 E. 55 poles crossing the branch at 40 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Graham and Gross Scrugg's assees. 168 acres of land on part of four Military Warrants, Graham 15 acres on No. 5765, 67 acres on No. 5758, 60 acres on No. 5791 and Scruggs 26 acres on No. 5916, on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks, Northwesterly corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 7064; thence with the line of the said Survey, S. 83 E. 222 poles crossing a large branch at 20, at 110 at 129 and at 158 poles to two Jack Oaks and a White Oak, all Sapplings in the line of Alexander Keer's Survey No. 5128; thence with said line N. 26 W. 109 poles crossing the branch to a Stake in said line; thence S. 63 W. 28 poles to a large Bur Oak; thence N. 57 W. 71 poles to a Stake; thence West 303 poles to a White Oak and Red Elm in the lower line of Lucas Sullivant's Survey No. 3162; and upper back corner to Robert Kays Entry No. 4605; thence with said line S. 32 W. 32 poles to a Stake in a prairie, lower back corner to Sullivant and beginning corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 7751 & 7774; thence with his line N. 82 E. 55 poles to a Stake in a prairie, corner to Dun; thence with another of his lines and passing his corner, and with the line of said Graham's Survey No. 7390, East 146 poles to two Bur Oaks, Northeasterly corner to Graham's said Survey; thence South 78 poles crossing the large branch at 64 poles to two forked Bur Oaks and a Jack Oak, Southeasterly corner to said Graham; thence with another of his lines West 17 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line; thence South 63 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence East 50 poles to a Bur Oak in Galloway's line; thence with said line N. 2 W. 68 poles to the beginning.
