Fulton, assee. 999 acres of land on part of three Military Warrants, viz: 200 acres on No. 5978, 533 acres on No. 6045 and 266 acres on No. 5932, on the waters of Bradford's fork of Deer creek. Beginning at a Hickory and small bur Oak, Southwesterly corner to the Representatives of William Russell's Survey No. 6110, in the line of James Dunlap's Entry No. 7467, running with Russell's line, S. 83 W. 180 poles to a Black Oak and Bur Oak in said line and Northeast corner to the Representatives Survey No. 6111; thence with said line South 130 poles to a Bur Oak, Southeast corner to said Survey; thence West 180 poles to two Bur Oaks,
