


Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 355 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 206 acres on No. 6076 and 149 acres on No. 6089, on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks, Northeasterly corner to the Representatives of William Carter's Survey No. 5874; thence with their line South 182 poles crossing a branch to two Bur Oaks and Elm and Black Oak, corner to said Survey; thence with another of their lines, East 86 poles to three Bur Oaks an Easterly corner to the said Survey; thence with another of their lines, South 144 poles crossing a branch to two Bur Oaks and an Elm, Southeasterly corner to their Survey; thence S. 87° 30' E. 132 poles to a Bur Oak on the West side of a road; thence North 146 poles crossing a branch at 10 poles to a Hickory and Jack Oak; thence East 76 poles to a Bur Oak;

thence North 70 poles crossing a branch at 54 poles to four White Oaks; thence West 100 poles crossing the branch at 36 and at 40 poles to a Bur Oak; thence South 19 poles to three Bur Oaks, two of them from one root; thence West 94 poles to two Bur Oaks from one root; thence North 135 poles crossing a branch at 100 and one at 104 poles to two Bur Oaks thence West 66 poles crossing a branch to a Stake in a prairie; thence North 90 poles crossing a branch to two Hickories from one root and a Bur Oak; thence West 93 poles to a Bur Oak; thence South 90 poles crossing a branch at 80 poles to a Hickory in the line of the Representatives of William Carter's said Survey; thence with their line East 59 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Walter Dun, John Graham and Gross Scruggs, assees. and James Johnston 221 acres of land on part of several Military Warrants, Dun 20 acres on No. 5735, 38 acres on No. 6124, Graham 14 acres on No. 5791, Scruggs 101 acres on No. 5916 and Johnston 48 acres on No. 5792, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at three Jack Oaks and a Bur Oak, S. 9 W. 326 poles from the Southwesterly corner of James Galloway's Survey No. 7285; thence S. 35 E. 112 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 53 E. 33 poles to a Black Oak; thence S. 37 E. 120 poles to a Hickory; thence N. 40 E. 82 poles to two Elms and a Jack Oak; thence N. 35 W. 100 poles to a Stake; thence N. 72 E. 62 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 2 W. 122 poles to an Elm; thence S. 88 W. 106 poles to a forked Bur Oak; thence S. 2 W. 36 poles to an Elm on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 40 W. 120 poles to the beginning.
