


Surveyed for George Clark, assee. 250 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5514, on the waters of Treacles Creek. Beginning at four White Oaks and a Hickory, S. 40 W. 84 poles from the upper corner in the creek of James Galloway's Survey No. 6202; thence S. 40 W. 18 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 6 E. 56 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 49 W. 126 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 40 W. 109 poles to three Hickories, a White Oak and four Bur Oaks, two of the Bur Oaks from one root; thence S. 87 W. 115 poles to a Bur Oak, an Easterly corner to Gross Scrugg's Survey No. 7876; thence with his line N. 2 E. 94 poles, crossing the road from Columbus to Springfield to a Stake in a prairie, Northeast corner to Scrugg's said Survey; thence North 48 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 82 E. 131 poles to a Bur Oak in a prairie; thence S. 60 E. 177 poles crossing a small branch at 28, one at 52, one at 65 the road at 80, a branch at 144 and one at 175 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for George Clark, assee. 258-1/3 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants 158-1/3 acres on No. 5514 and 100 acres on No. 5420, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Hickories and a forked Jack Oak, Easterly corner to John Graham's Survey No. 7928, and corner to Robertson Burge's Survey No. 8083; thence with Burge's line N. 69 E. 100 poles to a Stake in a prairie, in the line of David Bradford's Survey No. 5280; thence with said line S. 33° 30' E. 199 poles crossing a branch at 105 and at 141 poles to two Black Oaks and two Hickories; thence S. 66 W. 95 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory, on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 67° 30' W. 146 poles to four Hickories, three of them from one root, Northeasterly corner to Graham and Scrugg's Survey No. 8081; thence S. 87° 30' W. 57 poles to three Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie, corner to their Survey; thence N. 9 E. 96 poles to two Hickories, Southerly corner to Graham's Survey No. 7928; thence with his line N. 25 E. 148 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for David Chapman, assee. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6489, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks two from one root, Southwesterly corner of Walter Dun's Survey No. 8470; thence with the South line of said Survey, correcting the course S. 85½ E. 157 poles to a Jack Oak and two Bur Oaks, Northwesterly corner to James Johnson's Survey No. 7395; thence with his line S. 21 W. 140 poles, crossing a branch at 68 poles to three Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie, Westerly corner of said Johnston's said Survey; thence N. 70 W. 134 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the East line of John Evans' Survey No. 10469; thence with said line N. 6 E. 102 poles, crossing a branch at 41 poles to the beginning.
