



Surveyed for David Chapman, assee. 700 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6489 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak & Hickory, Westerly corner to James Johnston's Survey No. 7394; thence with a

line of said Survey S. 15 E. 132 poles to two Bur Oaks, (both down) another corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Survey S. 50 E. 40 poles to three Bur Oaks, two from one root, (all dead), another corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Survey N. 46 E. 92 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory (crossing a branch at 45 poles) a Westerly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 7752; thence with a line of said Survey S. 78 E. 50 poles to four Bur Oaks, two from one root, another corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Survey N. 69 E. 52 poles to a Stake in said line; thence S. 10 E. 156 poles to a Stake in the North line of Nathan Haine's Survey No. 7791; thence with said line S. 76 W. 402 poles crossing a branch at 252 poles to three Bur Oaks, Easterly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 11008; thence with a line of said Survey N. 34 W. 124 poles to a Stake on the edge of a prairie from which a Bur Oak marked as a corner bears S. 59 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 5-1/5 poles, another of Dun's corners; thence with another of his lines N. 81 W. 119 poles to two Bur Oaks, another of Dun's corners; thence with another of his lines S. 32 W. 28 poles to a Bur Oak, Westerly corner to Dun's said Survey; thence with another of Dun's lines S. 32 E. 24 poles to three Hickories in said line; thence S. 38 W. 40 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root; thence N. 50 W. 80 poles to a Stake in a prairie, from which a Bur Oak marked as a corner bears S. 50 W. 12 poles; thence N. 28 E. 211 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Westerly corner to John Evan's Survey No. 10470, from which a Bur Oak marked as a corner bears N. 80 E. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  poles; thence with Evan's line S. 60 E. 120 poles to a Stake in a prairie, his Southerly corner, from which two Bur Oaks marked as a corner bears N. 5 E. 9 poles; thence with another of Evan's lines N. 38 E. 164 poles to a Stake, in a prairie, his Easterly corner, from which a Bur Oak marked as a corner bears N. 80 W. 5 poles; thence S. 78 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 95 poles, crossing a small branch to the beginning.
