


Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 100 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants 28 acres on No. 6098 and 72 acres on No. 5885, on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at a Black Oak and small Hickory, in the line of Nathan Haine's Survey No. 7791, N. 76 E. 322 poles from his Northwesterly corner; thence with said line N. 76 E. 103 poles to three Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie, in said line; thence N. 34 W. 120 poles to a Stake in a prairie 5-1/10 poles N. 59 1/2 E. from a Bur Oak marked as a corner; thence N. 81 W. 119 poles to two on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 32 W. 28 poles to a bur oak Bur Oaks and small Hickory on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 32 E. 146 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory, in the line of Haines said Survey; thence with said line N. 76 E. 21 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 120 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 90 acres on No. 5988 and 30 acres on No. 5885, on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks one of them forked, the Northerly corner to James Johnston's Survey No. 7239, in the line of James Galloway's Survey No. 6973; thence with Johnston's line S. 23 W. 170 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line; thence N. 68 W. 102 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 14 E. 180 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 64 E. 130 poles, passing the corner of Galloway's said Survey at 86 poles and with his line to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Galloway, Junr. assee. 380 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 6467 and 180 acres on part of No. 5902, on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a Stake near a Bur Oak 7 poles N. 50 W. from the Westerly corner of John Crawford's Survey No. 6201, and Northerly corner to Nathaniel Sawyer's Entry No. 10608, as amended on the 20th day of August 1821, running N. 50 W. 160 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 70 W. 210 poles to a White Oak near a cabin in a field, in the line of said Galloway's Survey No. 7403; thence with said line South 226 poles, passing his corner at 56 poles to a Hickory; thence East 70 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 50 E. 160 poles to a Stake; thence N. 40 E. 200 poles to the beginning.
