


Surveyed for James Galloway junr. assee. and William Schooler 205 acres of land, Galloway 100 acres on a Military Warrant No. 6458, 60 acres on part of No. 6433 and 20 acres on No. 6303 and Schooler 25 acres on No. 6499, on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's Creek. Beginning at a Red Oak, Bur Oak and Hickory, Northerly corner to said Galloway's Survey No. 7402; thence with his line S. 77 E. 160 poles to a Bur Oak, corner to said Survey; thence S. 22 E. 64 poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak and Hickory, corner to said Survey; thence S. 75 E. 50 poles to three Bur Oaks in said line, corner to Walter Dun and others Survey No. 7924, 8441 & 8442; thence with their line N. 50 E. 104 poles to two Bur Oaks corner to said Survey in the line of William Raleigh's Survey No. 5483 & 5484; thence with his line N. 40 W. 28 poles to a Black Oak, Westerly corner his Survey and Southerly corner to John Patterson's Survey No. 5601; thence with his line N. 50 W. 240 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 35 W. 82 poles to a Stake in said line, corner to the Representatives of Thomas Ruffin's Survey No. 6196; thence with his line S. 15 W. 194 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Galloway, junr. assee. 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 3617 on the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at three White Oaks, Southerly corner to John Gibson's Survey No. 2445; thence with his line N. 53 E. 87 poles to three White Oaks in said line, Westerly corner to William Heth's Survey No. 4752; thence with his line, S. 30 E. 91 poles to two White Oaks and a Hickory, Northerly corner to William Pelham's Survey No. 6570; thence with his line S. 60 W. 286 poles to a Black Walnut, Elm and White Oak, corner to the Representatives of Anthony T. Dixon's Survey No. 7055; thence with said line N. 30 W. 30 poles to two Bur Oaks and two Elms, corner to his Survey and Southeasterly corner to Richard C. Anderson's Survey No. 6306; thence with his line N. 11 W. 149 poles to a Stake, Northeasterly corner to his Survey, in the line of Gladden and Bailey's Survey No. 6299; thence with their line N. 79 E. 161 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak corner to their Survey, in the line of Gibson's said Survey; thence with said line S. 37 E. 35 poles to the beginning.
