


Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 140 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5797 on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks, Southwesterly corner to Rice Haggard's Survey No. 7056, in the line of said Dun's Survey No. 7754; thence with Haggard's line S. 84 E. 192 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to Haggard's said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 64 E. 74 poles to a Black Oak and Bur Oak corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 85 E. 62 poles to a Stake, Southeasterly corner to said Haggard's Survey and Southwesterly to Gabriel Peterson's Survey No. 4637; thence with Peterson's line, S. 81 E. 20 poles to a Stake in said line, Northwesterly corner to Joseph Chamber's Survey No. 7398; thence with his line South 36 poles to two Bur Oaks one of them forked in said line, Northeasterly corner to James Johnston's Survey No. 7395; thence with said line S. 83 W. 160 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Jack Oak, Northwesterly corner to Johnston's said Survey; thence N. 81° 30' W. 95 poles to three Bur Oaks, one of them forked; thence N. 6 E. 78 poles, passing the Southeasterly corner of Duns said Survey at 51 poles to the beginning.




Surveyed for Walter Dun, John Graham, assees. and James Johnston 160 acres of land on part of three Military Warrants, Dun 64 acres on No. 6125, Graham 8 acres on No. 5786 and Johnston 88 acres on No. 5792 on Gladly run a branch of Deer creek. Beginning at a forked White Oak, Westerly corner to Lincoln Goodale's Survey No. 6644; thence with his line N. 40 E. 106 poles crossing the run at 40 poles, passing Goodale's Northerly corner at 72 poles to two Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 68 W. 173 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence North 74 poles to four Black Oaks and a Bur Oak, Southeasterly corner to Graham & Scrugg's Survey No. 7828; thence with their line West 105 poles crossing the run at 92 poles to a forked Bur Oak on the edge of the run prairie, Southwesterly corner to their said Survey; thence S. 23 E. 82 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak; thence S. 20 E. 104 poles crossing a branch at 22 poles and at 88 poles to a Bur Oak; thence S. 60 E. 73 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence S. 85 E. 44 poles crossing a branch at 12 poles to two White Oaks from one root; thence S. 72 E. 21 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Henry Fox, Nathaniel Fox, Polly Abbott, Philadelphia Pumphrey, Elizabeth Q. Fox and Catherine Comer, heirs of Nathaniel Fox, decd. 90 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5840, on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at four Bur Oaks from one root on the edge of a prairie, S. 36 W. 56 poles from a Hickory and forked Black Oak, Westerly corner to James Johnston's Survey No. 7339; thence S. 20 E. 112 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 82 W. 166 poles to four Bur Oaks; thence N. 45 W. 40 poles to seven White Oaks; thence N. 28 E. 75 poles to seven Bur Oaks; thence S. 84 E. 122 poles to the beginning.
