

Surveyed for John Poe and Thomas Scott, assees. 467 acres of land, Poe 100 acres on a Military Warrant No. 6311 and Scott 367 acres on part of Warrant No. 5551, on the waters of the North fork of Paint Creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks and a White Oak, Southeast corner to the Representatives of William Russell's Survey No. 6070 and Northwest corner to James Dunlap's Survey No. 9854; thence with Russell's line West 200 poles to two Black Oaks and Hickory; Southwest corner to said Survey; thence with another line thereof North 160 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Hickory, Northwest corner to said Survey in the line of James Clark's Survey No. 8878; thence with said line West 120 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Southwest corner to said Survey in the line of Moore & Creighton's Survey No. 5476 and 5672; thence with said line South 74 poles to two Elms, corner to said Survey; thence with another line thereof East 60 poles to an Elm corner to said Survey; thence with another line thereof South 170 poles to a Stake, Southeast corner to said Survey in the line of Robinson & Creighton's Survey No. 6050, 7263 & 7799; thence with said line East 110 poles to a Black Oak and barren Oak, Northeast corner to said Survey; thence with said line S. 2 W. 194 poles to four Bur Oaks in said line, Northwest corner to William Fulton's Survey No. 8056; thence with Fulton's line East 146 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Northeast corner to said Survey; thence with said line South 81 poles to two Hickories and an Elm corner to said Survey in the line of Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence with said line N. 69 E. 72 poles crossing a branch to a Stake in a prairie in said line and in the line of William Robinson's Survey No. 6049; thence with said line North 170 poles passing the Northwesterly corner of said Survey at 16 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the line of Dunlap's said Survey; thence with said line West 64 poles to a Stake, three Bur Oaks and a Post Oak, Southwest corner to said Survey; thence with another line thereof North 160 poles to the beginning.

Beginning at four White Oaks three from one root, the most Easterly corner of Bryder and Hurts Survey No. 8505, in the line of Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence with said line S. 20 E. 98-3/4 poles crossing a branch at 76 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak in said line; thence S. 70 W. 108 poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak, Southeasterly corner to Bryder and Hurts said Survey; thence with their line N. 20 W. 98-3/4 poles to a Bur Oak and Black Oak, corner to their Survey; thence with another of their lines N. 70 E. 108 poles crossing a branch at 12 poles to the beginning.
