


Surveyed for Charles Bryder and Merewether Hurt, 266-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4797 on the waters of Paint creek. Beginning at a Stake in a prairie an inside or middle corner to Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence with his line N. 70 E. 265 poles to a White Oak corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 20 E.  $102\frac{1}{2}$  poles to four White Oaks in said line; thence S. 70 W. 108 poles crossing a small branch at 96 poles to a Bur Oak and Black Oak; thence S. 20 E.  $98\frac{3}{4}$  poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak; thence S. 70 W. 157 poles to four small Jack Oaks in a line of said Survey; thence with it N. 20 W.  $201\frac{1}{2}$  poles to the beginning.


Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 160 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6119 on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak and Hickory, Westerly corner to Alexander Kerr's Survey No. 5129; thence with his line S. 47 E. 68 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to Kerr's said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 80 E. 24 poles to a Stake in said line, upper back corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 6969; thence with Galloway's line S. 5 W. 96 poles to a Stake corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 52 W. 84 poles to a Stake in said line; thence S. 82 W. 74 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 39 W. 103 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 14 E. 78 poles to three Bur Oaks in the line of said Dun's Survey No. 8417; thence with his line East 45 poles to a Bur Oak an easterly corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Survey, North 70 poles crossing a branch at 54 poles to four White Oaks, Northeasterly corner to said Survey; thence S. 81 E. 80 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Graham, Gross Scruggs assees. and James Johnston 280 acres of land on part of four Military Warrants Graham 207 acres on No. 5791, 17 acres on No. 5786, Scruggs 10 acres on No. 5916 and Johnston 46 acres on No. 5792 on the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak, Southerly corner to said Johnston's Survey No. 7241 and Southerly corner to said Scrugg's Survey No. 7759; thence N. 51 E. 99 poles to two White Oaks, corner to Scruggs; thence N. 55 E. 41 poles to three Bur Oaks, Southeasterly corner to Scrugg's said Survey, Southwesterly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 7751 & 7774 and Northwesterly corner to said Dun's Survey No. 8484; thence with the line of the last mentioned Survey S. 4 W. 292 poles to a Bur Oak, Southwesterly corner to Dun's said Survey, Northwesterly corner to said Graham's Survey No. 7385 and Northeasterly corner to said Johnston's Survey No. 7416; thence N. 74 W. 225 poles passing Johnston's Northwesterly corner at 185 poles to a Stake in the line of said Johnston's Survey No. 7239; thence with said line N. 6 E. 44 poles to two White Oaks and a Hickory, corner to said Survey; thence with another line thereof North 171 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Northeasterly corner to said Survey; thence S. 53 E. 27 poles to three Bur Oaks, Westerly corner to said Johnston's Survey No. 7241; thence with his line S. 60 E. 114 poles to the beginning.
