


Surveyed for John Graham, assee and James Johnston  
 462 acres of land on part of three Military Warrants,  
 Graham 196 acres on No. 5791, 104 acres on No. 5787  
 and Johnston 162 acres on No. 5792, on  
 the waters of Darby's creek. Beginning  
 at two Thorns and an Elm, Southeast  
 corner to the Representatives of James  
 Winkfield's Survey No. 4573, Southwest

corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 7070, and Northerly corner to Robert Dun's Survey  
 No. 8428; thence with Dun's line South 164 poles to two Elms and a small Jack Oak, South-  
 west corner to Dun's said Survey in the line of the Representatives of William Carter's  
 Survey No. 5874; thence with said line and the line of John Crawford's Survey No. 7075,  
 West 121 poles to two Elms and a Bur Oak, Northwesterly corner to Crawford's Survey; thence  
 N. 76 W. 93 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence North 87 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak; thence  
 West 80 poles to two Hickories; thence South 25 poles to a Hickory; thence West 159 poles  
 to two White Oaks in the line of Nathan Haines Survey No. 7791; thence with said line,  
 N. 10 W. 162 poles to a Stake in said line; thence East 339 poles passing four Bur Oaks  
 at 23 poles to a large Bur Oak in the line of Winkfield's said Survey; thence with said  
 line South 80 poles crossing a branch at 20 poles to a Black Oak, Bur Oak and Elm, South-  
 west corner to said Winkfield's Survey; thence with another line of said Survey East 138  
 poles crossing a branch to the beginning.


Surveyed for Lawrence Trent, 1000 acres of land

 Walnuts and two Honey Locusts, Northwest corner  
 to Thomas Pemberton's Survey No. 1133; thence  
 North 400 poles to a White Oak, Black Oak and  
 Hickory and Cherry tree, Northeast corner to  
 William White's Survey No. 3642; thence East 400  
 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak, North-  
 west corner to Nathaniel Terry's Survey No. 1241  
 thence South 400 poles to a Stake in a prairie,  
 Northeast corner to Pemberton's said Survey;

thence West 400 poles to the beginning.

 Oaks; thence South 80 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence West 100 poles  
 to an Ash and Hickory; thence North 80 poles to the beginning.
