

Beginning at two sugartrees south corner to John M. Gregory's Survey No. 3679, in the line of William Brown's Survey No. 1478; thence with said line S. 37 E. 187 poles to a sugartree and hickory west corner to Kendall Thomas' Survey No. 3474 for 164 acres; thence with a line of Thomas' said Survey, N. 53 E. 188 poles to a sugartree and ash, north corner to said Survey; thence N. 37 W. 187 poles to a sugartree and ash, east corner to Gregory's said Survey; thence with a line thereof S. 53 W. 188 poles to the beginning.


Surveyed for Smith Snead, 529 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 1159 on Duff's fork of Deer Creek. Beginning at two burr oaks, in the line of the representatives of Benjamin Harrison's Survey No. 9018; thence N. 25 W. 322 poles to two post oaks; thence N. 65 E. 208 poles crossing the fork at 88 poles to a post oak in the line Suvall Osgood's Survey No. 8489; thence with his line and the line of Thomas Hill's heirs Survey No. 8876, S. 25 E. 520 poles to two burr oaks; thence West 191 poles crossing the fork at 114 poles to a stake in a prairie; the beginning corner to Harrison's said survey; thence with the lines thereof, N. 17 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 71 poles to a burr oak, corner to said Survey; thence N. 45 W. 38 poles to a burr oak, corner to said Survey; thence West 28 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Casady, 466- $\frac{2}{3}$  acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 3731, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a beech, southeast corner to Charles Simms' Survey No. 1479; thence N. 53 E. 324 poles to a black oak, ash and elm; thence N. 37 W. 280 poles to two hickories and a sugartree; thence S. 53 W. 164 poles crossing the post road at 104 poles to a small water beech or hornbeam, southeast corner to Augustine I. Smith's Survey No. 3245; thence S. 37 E. 100 poles to a small elm and ash; thence S. 53 W. 160 poles to a beech, southwest corner to George McCredie's Survey No. 3876; thence S. 37 E. 180 poles to the beginning.
