


Surveyed for George Dawson and John Dawson, assees. 544 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants George 494 acres on No. 6062 and John 50 acres on No. 6060, on the waters of Treacle's Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak, lower back corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 5996 and Southeasterly corner to John Graham's Survey No. 7826; thence with Graham's line S. 81 W. 122 poles to a Bur Oak, Southwesterly corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines North 25 poles to a Stake in a prairie, corner to Graham's said Survey and Easterly corner to Robert Mean's Survey No. 5148; thence with Mean's line S. 65 W. 98 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie, Northerly corner to Mean's said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 25 W. 170 poles crossing two drains to a White Oak in said line, the most Easterly corner to Richard Call's Survey No. 4809; thence with Call's line S. 68 W. 203 poles crossing a branch at 130 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Southwesterly corner to Call's said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 18 W. 160 poles crossing a branch at 10 poles to three White Oaks, one of them forked, Westerly corner to Call's said Survey; thence N. 86° 45' W. 84 poles to a Bur Oak, Southeasterly corner to said Graham's Survey No. 7530 & 7827; thence S. 19 W. 208 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 60 E. 168 poles crossing a branch at 140 poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak; thence S. 86 E. 290 poles to five White Oaks, two of them from one root; thence N. 70° 30' E. 286 poles to a Red Oak in the line of Walter Dun's Survey No. 7835; thence with said line N. 22 W. 19 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, Northwesterly corner to Dun's said Survey, in the line of said Galloway's Survey; thence with said line S. 80 W. 30 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 70 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants 55 acres on No. 6098 and 15 acres on No. 5713 on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's creek. Beginning at a White Oak, Hickory and Red Elm, Southerly corner to Beverly Stubblefield's Survey No. 5436 and Easterly corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 6442; thence with Stubblefield's line N. 40 E. 111 poles crossing a branch at 71 poles to a Hickory and Red Elm in said line, Westerly corner to the representatives of David Drummond's Survey No. 5478; thence with said Drummond's line S. 40 E. 108 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Southerly corner to their Survey; thence S. 48° 30' W. 124 poles crossing a branch in a wet prairie to two Hickories on its edge; thence N. 40 W. 104 poles crossing a branch at 54 poles to two large White Oaks from one root, in the line of Galloway's said Survey; thence with said line East 20 poles to the beginning.
