

 Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 465 acres of land on part of Five Military Warrants, 11 acres on No. 5885, 40 acres on No. 5870, 19 acres on No. 5825, 120 acres on No. 6523 and 275 acres on No. 6521, on the waters of the Spring fork of Treacle's Creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks, Southwesterly corner to John Graham's Survey No. 7530 & 7827; thence N. 81 W. 124 poles to a large forked Black Oak, corner to Dun and others Survey No. 10789 & 10791; thence S. 20 W. 70 poles to a Hickory and two Bur Oaks; thence S. 28 W. 100 poles to five Hickories, corner to Gross Scrugg's Survey No. 7828; thence with his line S. 71 E. 80 poles to three Hickories and a Bur Oak, his Northeasterly corner; thence S. 57 E. 170 poles to two Bur Oaks on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 32 W. 156 poles to a forked Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence S. 66 E. 12 poles to a Bur Oak, Northwesterly corner to said Graham's Survey No. 7560; thence with his line S. 70 E. 106 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to said Survey; thence S. 61 E. 76 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie, corner to said Survey; thence N. 70 E. 54 poles to a Stake and Bur Oak; thence N. 3 E. 116 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 15 W. 10 poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak, Southerly corner to George and John Dawson's Survey No. 8767; thence with their line N. 60 W. 158 poles crossing a branch to two White Oaks, Southwesterly corner to said Survey; thence with another of their lines N. 19 E. 200 poles to a Stake in said line; thence N. 85 E. 84 poles to three White Oaks, one of them forked, Northerly corner to said Survey and Westerly corner to said Dun's Survey No. 10788; thence with his line N. 68 E. 65 poles to four White Oaks, one of them forked in said line, most Easterly corner to Dun and others Survey No. 10789 & 10791; thence with their line, N. 62½ W. 125 poles to a Stake in a prairie, corner to said Survey and Northeasterly corner to said Graham's Survey No. 7530 & 7827; thence South 60 poles to a Black Oak, corner to said Survey; thence S. 47 W. 42 poles to a Bur Oak, the most Southerly corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 66½ W. 114 poles, crossing a small branch to the beginning.
