



Surveyed for Mary and Mills Reddick, 2200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5921, on the waters of Deer Creek and Little Darby. Beginning at a Bur Oak <sup>6786</sup> <sub>5433</sub> beginning corner to Dun and Graham's Survey No. 8082; thence S.  $77\frac{1}{2}$  E. 62 poles to two Hickories, Westerly corner to Graham and Scrugg's Survey No. 8081; thence with the line of said Survey, S. 29 E. 138 poles to a Hickory, their corner; thence S. 85 E. 151 poles to a Stake, corner to said Survey; thence N. 5 W. 52 poles to four Bur Oaks, corner to said Survey; thence N. 7 W. 49 poles to four Bur Oaks; thence with another of their lines, N. 15 W. 98 poles to four Hickories, Northeasterly corner to said Survey; thence N.  $68\frac{1}{2}$  E. 141 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak, corner to James Herron's Survey No. 7841; thence with the supposed line of said Survey, N. 66 E. 95 poles to two Black Oaks and two Hickories, Easterly corner to said Herron's Survey; thence N.  $21\frac{1}{2}$  W. 66 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak, in the line of said Survey and corner to Dixon's Survey No. 7055; thence with a line of said Survey S. 56 E. 153 poles to a Black Walnut, White Oak and Hickory, corner to Dixon, in the line of William Bond's Survey No. 5294; thence with said line S. 34 W. 160 poles to three White Oaks, Westerly corner to said Survey; thence S. 56 E. 181 poles passing said Bond's Southerly corner at 120 poles, crossing a branch at 145 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory, in the line of James Law's Survey No. 5193, and corner to William Croghan's Survey No. 6297; thence with the line of his Survey S. 25 W. 110 poles to a Black Oak, Bur Oak and Elm, corner to said Survey; thence S. 30 E. 202 poles crossing a branch at 52 and one at 146 poles to two Black Oaks from one root, and an Elm, corner to said Survey and corner to Graham, Dun and Scrugg's Survey No. 8423; thence with their line S. 60 W. 98 poles to a Hickory and Black Oak, their corner; thence S. 51 E. 115 poles to a Stake in the line of Berryman Green's Survey No. 6285; thence with said line West 214 poles to four Hickories and a White Oak corner to said Green's Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 20 W. 121 poles to three Elms, a Maple and Bur Oak, corner to said Survey supposed to be in the line of Richard Apperson's Survey No. 5433; thence N.  $70^{\circ} 25'$  W. 280 poles to an Elm, Jack Oak
