


Surveyed for William Eustace, heir at law to Capt. John Eustace, dec'd., 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2157, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two ash's an elm and red oak, northwest corner to Patrick Carnes Survey No. 1256, northeast corner to Abraham Maurney's Survey No. 1344 and southeast corner to Thomas Pemberton's Survey No. 1133, running North 400 poles to a stake in a prairie, northeast corner to Pemberton; thence East 400 poles crossing a branch at 340 poles to a cherry tree, two post white oaks and an elm, southwest corner to William S. Smith's Survey No. 1362 and northwest corner to Samuel K. Bradford's Survey No. 1310; thence South 400 poles to three white oaks, southwest corner to Bradford, northwest corner to William Washington's Survey No. 1284 and northeast to Patrick Carne's Survey; thence with Carne's line West 400 poles crossing a branch to the beginning.

Surveyed for Andrew Dunscomb, assignee, 710 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 11, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at a red oak red bud, white oak, hickory and black ash, in the line of William S. Smith's Survey No. 1362 and northwest corner to John Peyton's Survey No. 1244; thence with Peyton's line, East 355 poles to three elms and a black ash, northeast corner to Peyton; thence North 320 poles to a stake in a prairie; thence West 355 poles to two hickories and two elms; thence South 320 poles with the line of Thomas Sheldon's Survey, and said Smith's line to the beginning.
