


Surveyed for John M. Gregory, heir to John Gregory, dec'd, 200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4594, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two hickories and a white oak, upper back corner to William Brown's Survey No. 1478, and in the lower line of Charles Simms' Survey No. 1187, running with Brown's line S. 37 E. 179 poles to two sugar trees in Brown's line; thence N. 53 E. 179 poles to an elm and sugartree; thence N. 37 W. 179 poles to two ash's in Simms' line; thence with said line S. 53 W. 179 poles to the beginning.


Lucas Sullivant, D.S.

Surveyed for Lucas Sullivant, assignee, 666-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4868 on Darby's Creek. Beginning at two hickories and two lynns on the upper side of the Creek, upper corner on the Creek to Charles Simms Survey No. 1479, running up the creek with the meanders thereof N. 40 W. 180, N. 20 E. 105, N. 40 E. 30, N. 15 E. 34, N. 25 W. 22, N. 45 W. 48, S. 80 W. 64, N. 27 W. 38, N. 15 E. 30 poles to three buckeyes, on the back of the Creek; thence N. 53 E. 198 poles to two sugartrees; thence S. 37 E. 425 poles crossing several drains to an ash and sugartree; thence S. 53 W. 302 poles with Simms' line to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Steel, assignee, 400 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1741, on Deer Creek. Beginning at a honey locust, white thorn and sycamore on the south side of Deer Creek where the Indian Trace that leads up Deer Creek to Mad River crosses the last time, running S. 42 E. 100 poles to two hickories; thence N. 48 E. 320 poles to a stake; thence N. 42 W. 200 poles crossing the Creek at 100 poles to a bunch of willows in a marsh; thence S. 48 W. 320 poles crossing a fork of the Creek at 294 poles to a black oak and white oak; thence S. 42 E. 100 poles crossing the Creek at the fork, to the beginning.
