


Surveyed for Joseph Spencer 145 acres of land part of two Military Warrants viz: 45 acres on No. 6568 and 100 acres on No. 6570, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks, Easterly corner to James Low's Survey No. 5193; thence with his line N. 56 W. 66 poles to three Bur Oaks and a Black Oak, corner to Richard C. Anderson's Survey No. 6305; thence with his line N. 34 E. 40 poles to a Bur Oak, corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines East 108 poles to a forked Bur Oak and Hickory, corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 60 E. 108 poles to a Bur Oak and White Oak, in said line, corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 8440; thence with Dun's line S. 38 E. 80 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, corner to his Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 52 W. 42 poles to a Bur Oak and large Jack Oak, corner to his Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 38 E. 74 poles to a Hickory; thence with another of his lines S. 85 E. 54 poles to an Elm and Bur Oak, corner to said Survey; thence S. 52 W. 62 poles to two Small White Oaks and small Black Oak; thence N. 38 W. 50 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, corner to William Croghan's Survey No. 6297; thence with his line N. 85 W. 210 poles to two Honey Locusts, an Elm and Black Walnut in the line of said Low's Survey; thence with said line, N. 34 E. 16 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 32 acres of land on parts of two Military Warrants 20 acres on No. 5139 and 12 acres on No. 6668 on the waters of Darby Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak in a prairie, a Southeasterly corner of said Dun's Survey No. 7754; thence N. 69 E. 115 poles to three Bur Oaks, the Southwesterly corner of said Dun's Survey No. 8470; thence with his line N. 6 E. 35 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line, the Southeast corner of said Dun's first mentioned Survey; thence with its line S. 82 W. 80 poles to two Bur Oaks, another of its corners; thence S. 25 W. 350 poles passing a stake ten links West of the first mentioned corner at 72 poles to a Stake in a prairie in a line of said Dun and David Chapman's Survey No. 10081, 10605, 10984, 10858 & 12171 of 458-1/3 acres, ten links S. 85 W. from a Stake in a prairie, a corner to their said Survey; thence with said line S. 85 W. 72 poles to two Jack Oaks and a Hickory, another of their corners, and a Northerly corner to said Dun's Survey No. 7752; thence with its line S. 38 E. 77 poles to a Hickory and three Bur Oaks, two of them from one root, another corner to said Survey No. 7752; thence with another line thereof N. 64 E. 36 poles to two Bur Oaks in said line, a corner to Dun and Chapman's said Survey; thence with their line N. 44 W. 38 poles to a Stake in a prairie, another of their corners; thence with another of their lines N. 35 E. 30 poles to a Stake in a prairie, another of their corners; thence N. 25 E. 276 poles to the beginning.
