

Beginning at a stake, easterly corner to the said representatives' Survey No. 3900 for 450 acres, running with their lower line S. 23 W. 250 poles, crossing the Creek to a stake; thence S. 67 E.

416 poles to two hickories and two white oaks from one root; thence N. 23 E. 250 poles crossing the Creek at 80 poles to two elms and a hickory; thence N. 67 W. 416 poles to the beginning.




Surveyed for the representatives of Mathew Arbuckle, dec'd. 900 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4931 on Deer Creek. Beginning at two elms and a hickory, easterly corner to the said representatives' Survey No. 3900 of six hundred and fifty acres, running with their lower line S. 23 W. 250 poles crossing the Creek at 170 poles to two white oaks from one root and two hickories, southerly corner to their

former Survey; thence S. 75 E. 240 poles to a stake; thence S. 31 E. 280 poles to a white oak; thence N. 59 E. 255 poles, crossing the Creek at 135 poles to three white oaks from one root; thence N. 31 W. 370 poles to two white oaks from one root; thence N. 75 W. 316 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Parill and James Thompson, assignees, 400 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 4926 on Deer Creek. Beginning at a white oak in the lower line of Ebenezer Owens' Survey No. 3902, running with his line, N. 59 E. 200 poles, crossing the Creek at 100 poles to two hickories and a black walnut; thence S. 26 E. 170 poles to two white oaks and an elm; thence S. 12 E. 166 poles to two white oaks from one root; thence S. 64 W. 200 poles crossing the Creek at 60 poles to two hickories and a black oak; thence N. 19 W. 318 poles to the beginning.
