Beginning at a Hickory and Post Oak, Southeast corner to Joseph Watkin's Survey No. 10907, in the West line of Henry Brushe's Survey No. 7272; thence with the South line of Watkin's said Survey West 41 poles to a Stake, northeast corner to William Robinson's Entry No. 8805; thence with the East line of said Entry, South 200 poles to a Stake in the North line of Peter P.
