


No. 13281. Surveyed for David Chapman, assee. 10 acres of land on part of a Military

Beginning at two Honey Locusts on the West bank of said Creek, upper corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 5125 and lower corner to Alexander Kerr's Survey No. 5128; thence with Kerr's line N. 85 W. 93 poles to a Stake, corner to said Survey; thence N. 26 W. 10 poles to two Jack Oaks and a White Oak (all down) Southeasterly corner to Graham and Scrugg's Survey No. 7758 & 7830; thence with their line N. 82 W. 39 poles to a Stake, Northeasterly corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 7064; thence with his line S. 10 E.  $34\frac{1}{2}$  poles to a Stake upper back corner to said Galloway's Survey No. 5125; thence with his line N. 85 E. 134 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Walter Dun, assee. 350 acres of land on part of four Military Warrants, to-wit: 133 acres on No. 5885, 89 acres on No. 5916, 79 acres on No. 5470 and 49 acres on No. 6523 on the waters of Little Darby's Creek. Beginning at five White Oaks, two of them from one root, at the most Southerly corner of George and John Dawson's Survey No. 8767; thence with their line N. 86 W. 41 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line, Northeasterly corner of Mary Stephenson's Survey No. 12142 and 12153; thence South 200 poles to a White Oak, another of said Stephenson's corners; of said

Survey; thence N. 63 E. 91 poles to a Bur Oak in a prairie; thence S. 73 E. 174 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie, a corner to Clark and Dun's Survey No. 8965 & 10927; thence N. 80 poles crossing a branch to a White Oak on the edge of a prairie, another corner to their said Survey; thence N. 50 E. 74 poles to a large Bur Oak, Northwest corner to Graham and Scrugg's Survey No. 7929; thence East 48 poles to a Stake in a prairie, corner to Dun and Jones Survey No. 8926, 8927 & 9391; thence with their line N. 54 W. 68 poles to a Bur Oak; thence N. 40 W. 57 poles crossing a branch to a Hickory, the most Westerly corner of said Survey; thence N. 51 E. 64 poles to three Hickories in the line of said Dun's Survey No. 7535; thence N. 22 W. 46 poles to a Red Oak, Southeasterly corner to said Dawson's said Survey; thence with their line S.  $70^{\circ} 30'$  W. 261 poles to the beginning.

Beginning at a Honey Locust and two Elms, lower corner on the Creek to Oliver Towle's Survey No. 2678; thence N. 53 E. 12 poles crossing the Creek to the line of George Gilpin's Survey No. 2604; thence with the several courses of said Survey, N. 70 W. 40 poles, N. 50 W. 30 poles, N. 38 W. 30 poles, N. 12 W. 20 poles to a White Oak, Hackberry and Buckeye, lower corner to said Gilpin's Survey No. 2605; thence N. 12 W. 20 poles, North 30 pole N. 27 E. 32 poles, N. 30 W. 20 poles, N. 62 W. 78 poles, N. 45 W. 20 poles; thence N. 15 W. 10 poles to a Stake in the line of said Survey; thence S. 53 W. 12 poles, crossing the Creek to a White Oak, Red Oak and Sugar tree, upper corner to Towle's said Survey No. 2678; thence binding on said Survey, S. 15 E. 10 poles, S. 45 E. 20 poles; S. 62 E. 78 poles, S. 30 E. 20 poles, S. 27 E. 32 poles, South 30 poles, S. 12 W. 40 poles, S. 32 W. 30 poles, S. 50 W. 30 poles, thence S. 70 W. 40 poles to the beginning.
