


Surveyed for Hubbard Wyatt, -Executor, 300 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 80 acres on No. 6267 and 220 acres on No. 6272 on the waters of Deer Creek. Beginning at three Bur Oaks, corner to the heirs of Nicholas Hobson's Survey No. 6348; thence with their line North 117 poles to four Bur Oaks, one of the westerly corners of said Survey; thence N. 5 W. 44 poles to a Stake in a prairie, 50 poles West of the Southwest corner of said Hobson's Survey No. 6350, corner to the Representatives of William Anderson's Survey No. 8950; thence with their line, North 30 poles to three White Oaks, corner to their Survey; thence with another of their lines West 293 poles passing the Southwest corner of said Survey at 128 poles to two White Oaks, Northeasterly corner of said Hobson's Survey No. 6349; thence S. 44 W. 24 poles to two Hickories and a Black Oak corner to said Survey; thence S. 46 E. 44 poles to a White Oak and Black Oak, corner to said Survey; thence S. 44 W. 74 poles to three White Oaks corner to said Survey in the line of William B. Harrison's Survey No. 6151; thence with said line S. 61 E. 165 poles to a Bur Oak and Elm, Northeast corner to said Survey in the line of Hobson's said Survey No. 6348; thence with said line N. 29 E. 64 poles crossing a branch to two Bur Oaks, Northwesterly corner to said Survey; thence S. 70 E. 171 poles to the beginning.

↑ 1/3 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, Ladds and Norvell 142-2/3 acres on No. 5870 and Dunlap 6-2/3 acres on No. 5978 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at seven White Oaks, Southwest corner to William Creighton's Survey No. 5468, and Southeast corner to James Dunlap's Survey No. 9854; thence with Dunlap's line West 88 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line, Easterly corner to Scott and Poe's Survey No. 8492 & 10356; thence with their line South 146 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Southeast corner to said Survey in the line of Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence with said line N. 69 E. 153 poles to two Hickories and two Post Oaks, Northeast corner to said Survey; thence with another of Smith's lines S. 20 E. 52 poles to a Hickory, Post Oak and Bur Oak in said line and in the line of William Robinson's Survey No. 6049; thence with Robinson's line S. 71 E. 103 poles to a Hickory and Jack Oak in said line and in the line of William McKee's Survey No. 5820; thence with McKee's line North 90 poles to two Hickories and a Post Oak, in said line, Southeasterly corner to said Robinson's Survey No. 6386; thence with said line West 116 poles to two Post Oaks, Southwest corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines North 82 poles to two Post Oaks Northwest corner to said Survey in the line of Creighton's said Survey; thence with said line West 55 poles to the beginning.
