


Surveyed for Ebenezer Owens, jun'r. assignee, 600 acres of land on five Military Warrants No. 1785, 4821, 4822, 4823 and 4824, on Deer Creek. Beginning at three white oaks two from one root, Easterly corner to a Survey of the representatives of Mathew Arbuckle No. 3901, running with the lower line of said Survey, S. 59 W. 255 poles crossing the Creek at 120 poles to a white oak, southerly corner to the said representatives Survey; thence S. 46 E. 395 poles crossing a branch at 140 poles to a black oak; thence N. 59 E. 255 poles crossing the Creek at 120 poles; to a stake in a prairie; thence N. 46 W. 395 poles to the beginning.




Surveyed for David Bradfor, assignee 800 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 3994, on a large branch, running into Deer Creek, on the lower side through Ambroes Gordon's Survey No. 862. Beginning at two elms, a black walnut and hickory on the east bank of the Creek one mile from the mouth, running S. 25 E. 160 poles to two white oaks and a hickory; thence S. 65 W. 400 poles to three white oaks; thence N. 25 W. 320 poles

crossing the branch at 165 poles to four white oaks, on the bank of the branch; thence N. 65 E. 400 poles to two white oaks; thence S. 25 E. 160 poles crossing the branch to the beginning.

Surveyed for David Bradford, assignee, 400 acres of land on two Military Warrants No. 4001 & 4021, on the waters of Deer Creek. Beginning at five hickories, northerly corner to James McNutt's Survey No. 4193, and easterly corner to William Evans' Survey No. 4124, running with Evans' line N. 70 W. 400 poles, crossing a large branch to two hickories corner to said Evans Survey in the line of said McNutt's Survey No. 3844;

thence with said line and course thereof N. 64 E. 500 poles crossing the branch at 406 poles to two white oaks; thence S. $11\frac{1}{2}$ W. 364 poles to the beginning.
