


Surveyed for Abraham Buford, assee. 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 674 on the waters of Paint creek. Beginning at two Ash's and an Elm, Northeast corner to William Washington's Survey No. 1284 and Southeast corner to Samuel K. Bradford's Survey No. 1310, running East 355 poles crossing a creek at 150 poles to two White Oaks and a Black Oak in the line of James Galt's Survey No. 1387; thence South with Gault's line 451 poles to two White Oaks and two Elms; thence West 355 poles crossing a branch at 20, the creek at 212, a branch at 232, at 296 and at 302^{poles}, to a Stake; thence North 451 poles crossing a branch at 254, the creek at 294 and at 394 poles to the beginning.


Surveyed for Patrick Carnes 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2223 on the waters of Paint creek. Beginning at two Ash and a Mulberry, Northwest corner to James Currie's Survey No. 1250, running with Currie's line East 400 poles crossing a



branch at 340 poles to two White Oaks and an Elm; thence North 400 poles to three White Oaks; thence West 400 poles to two Ash, an Elm and Red Oak; thence South 400 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Beck 200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 852 on the waters of Opossum run a branch of Deer creek. Beginning at a Black Oak and two Hickories, South corner to Robert Mean's Survey No. 5766; thence with his line N. 24 W. 92 poles to two Hickories and a Black Oak; thence S. 50 W. 100 poles to a Hickory and Black Oak, North corner to Henry Flesher's Survey No. 5190; thence with his line and the line of Charles Woodson's No. 6782, S. 38 E. 380 poles to a Black Oak and White Oak, Easterly corner to Woodson's said Survey; thence N. 52 E. 40 poles to a White Oak, Southwesterly corner to Duncan McArthur's Survey No. 6434; thence with McArthur's line N. 5 E. 160 poles crossing a small branch at 68 poles to five Hickories, Northwest corner to McArthur's said Survey; thence S. 62 W. 67 poles to a Stake; thence N. 28 W. 168 poles to a Stake in the lower line of Mean's said Survey; thence with said line S. 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 40 poles to the beginning.
