



Surveyed for Joseph Hites, 320 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5805 on Opossum run a branch of Deer creek. Beginning at two Hickories N. 30 W. 70 poles from the Easterly corner of Thomas Bell's Survey No. 462; thence <sup>S</sup> N.  $31\frac{1}{2}$  E. 160 poles to a small Jack Oak and small Cherry tree on the North side of a fence; thence East 46 poles crossing said fence and a stock yard to a Plum bush in a meadow, about three poles west of Opossum run; thence S.  $31\frac{1}{2}$  E. 18 poles crossing Opossum run to a Stake in John Oxford's meadow, supposed to be in the upper line of John S. Will's Entry No. 5426; thence with said line N. 75 E. 50 poles to a Stake, supposed to be the Northeast corner of Will's said entry; thence S. 15 E. 206 poles crossing a Spring branch at 148 poles to two large White Oaks growing together at the root on the Southeast side of a road; thence North 535 poles crossing a Spring branch and several small branches to two White Oaks growing together at the root; thence West 124 poles crossing the road and crossing the run at 90 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 30 W. 42 poles to two small White Oaks in the upper line of Elias T. Langham's Entry No. 9207; thence with said line East 117 poles crossing the run at 60 and the road at 96 poles to two Hickories and a White Oaks; thence South 157 poles crossing a small branch to two Hickories and a Bur Oak at the Southeast corner of Langham's said Entry; thence with the lower line thereof N. 56 W. 180 poles crossing a small branch at 28, the road at 38 and the run at 130 poles to two Jack Oaks; thence S. 30 W. 121 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Joseph Hite 225 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5805 on Opossum run a branch of Deer creek. Beginning at three White Oaks, Northwesterly corner to said Hite's Survey No. 9269; thence with the upper line thereof East 120 poles crossing Opossum run at 32 poles and the road to two White Oaks growing together at the root; thence North 53 poles to a Hickory and large White Oak in the line of Nathaniel Fox and others Survey No. 8478; thence with their line N. 48 W. 66 poles crossing the road at 50 poles to four White Oaks; thence N. 21 W. 38 poles to a White Oak and Elm; thence N. 10 W. 80 poles crossing a small branch at 8 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence North 20 poles to three Hickories; thence N. 30 E. 20 poles to two Bur Oaks on the bank of a drain; thence N. 37 E. 24 poles to a White Oak; thence N. 22 E. 48 poles to a White Oak and Bur Oak in the South line of George Renick's Survey No. 5824; thence with said line West 57 poles crossing the run at 45 poles to a Bur Oak corner to Renick's said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 60 W. 80 poles to a Stake corner to Tarlton Woodson's Survey No. 8800; thence with Woodson's line South 348 poles crossing a small branch to four Jack Oaks, Southeast corner to Woodson's said Survey; thence East 45 poles to the beginning.
