


Surveyed for Stephen Southall 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2270, on Deer Creek. Beginning at two white oaks from one root, Eastwardly corner to John Parrell and Joseph Thompson's Survey No. 3903, running with their lower line S. 64 W. 200 poles, crossing the creek at 60 poles to two hickories and black oak, Southwardly corner to said Parrell and Thompson's Survey; thence S. 26 E. 400 poles crossing a branch at 112 poles to two white oaks and an elm; thence N. 64 E. 560 poles crossing the creek at 176 poles and a branch at 405 poles to two

elms; thence N. 65 W. 515 poles, crossing a branch to a white oak; thence S. 64 W. 40 poles to the beginning.




Surveyed for Francis Cowherd 666-2/3 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 2642, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two ash's and an elm, northwest corner to Abraham Buford's Survey No. 1093 running with his line East 355 poles crossing the creek at 150 poles to two white oaks and a black oak, northeast corner to Buford, in the line of James Galt's Survey No. 1387; thence with Galt's line, North 302 poles, to a hickory and forked black

oak, in said line; thence West 355 poles crossing a branch at 15 and one at 237 poles to two ash's and two white oaks in the line of Samuel K. Bradford's Survey No. 1310; thence with said line, South 302 poles crossing the creek at 138 poles and a branch at 168 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Uriah Springer, 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 22, on the west fork of Deer Creek. Beginning at two white oaks and a hickory in the upper line of James Innis Survey No. 2696, running with his line N. 20 E. 300 poles crossing the creek at 150 poles, passing Innis's corner at 170 poles to a hickory, white oak and black oak; thence N. 70 W. 534 poles to two hickories and a white oak; thence S. 20 W. 300 poles, crossing the creek at 150 poles to three hickories from one root; thence S. 70 E. 534 poles to the beginning.
